## Sonora, Revolt Center, Known As "The Yankeeland Of Mexico"

WASHINGTON, Mar. 14. (AP)—Sonora, one of the several Mexican states which attained early prominence in the revolution, is dubbed by many Mexicans "the Yankeeland of Mexico" yet there are fewer Americans living there than in several other of the Mexican states. It has earned its nickname, rather, because American customs and goods have left a marked impress.

Nearly every well-to-do family among the merchants and ranchers has sent its sons and daughters to schools in the United States and it is not difficult to find natives who speak English fluently. There has been a stream of American goods into the state, and in Sonoran homes one constantly is seeing American phonographs, sewing machines, baby carriages and brass beds.

The state, which lies immediately south of Arizona and has a common boundary line with that state, is primarily a mining and cattle country. Rich silver, gold and copper mines have been operated since the coming of the Spaniards; and there are treasures, some of the rare minerals, never yet worked commercially. In the southern end of the state lies the valley of the Yabul river, home of the Yaqui Indians. All Mexican governments have found these Indians an unruly lot, and sanguinary wars have been fought with them.

Adjoining Sonora on the east lies Chihuahua, Mexico's biggest state. Immediately east of Chihuahua is Coahuila, another center of revolutionary activity. Coahuila is a semi-arid region crossed by mountains and with some desert patches; but with considerable areas on which wheat can be grown and cattle pastured. It was to that state that Texas was linked, when a century ago, that huge commonwealth was a part of Mexico. Coahuila, in the southern part of Coahuila, was the common capital.

Monterrey, which the revolutionists captured early, lies some 130 miles south of Laredo, Tex., and 500 miles north of Mexico City. It has a population of 100,000 and is one of the most progressive and modern cities in Mexico. Its chief importance from a military point of view is that it is the railway "nerve center" of the republic. Through Monterrey passes the main railway line between Mexico City and the eastern United States, crossing the United States-Mexican border at Laredo. Two other railroads from the border converge at Monterrey; one from Eagle Pass, Tex., and one from Brownsville, Tex., near the mouth of the Rio Grande.

The spokes of the city's wheel of railways also include a line extending due west to Torreon and the Mexican lake district, the main line south to San Luis Potosi and Mexico City, and a line southeastward to the port of Tampico.
