ELECTION PROCLAMATION

Whereas, the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, did, at a recessed regular meeting thereof held at Las Vegas, Nevada, on the 11th day of March, A. D. 1929, order the election of two Commissioners and a City Clerk for the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of said order, the undersigned, the Mayor Pro Tem of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, does hereby proclaim that such election will be held at the time and for purposes aforesaid, at the places hereinafter set forth, and that as such election the qualified voters of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, who actually reside in said city shall vote for the election of two commissioners and a city clerk for the City of Las Vegas.

The polls will be opened at 8:00 a. m. and will close at 6:00 p. m., on said 7th day of May, A. D. 1929. The City of Las Vegas has been divided into five voting precincts described as follows, to-wit:
