Champion Cowgirl and Cowboys Will Perform at Rodeo Here

Many champions of the range and rodeo will be on the job at the Boulder Dam rodeo in Las Vegas April 6 and 7, to be sponsored by the Las Vegas fire department, according to Chub Morgan, manager. Skeeter Bil Robbins, champion trick and fancy roper, has won fame wherever rodeos are held in all parts of the world, says Morgan, who has a list of championships Robbins has made and notables who have entertained him. Paris Williams, a diminutive lady who would not be suspected of being a cowgirl when met in street clothing, is champion lady rider of the world, said Morgan today. Not only did she win the bucking horse contest at Cheyenne last year, but she easily won the trick riding event also.

She performs that most difficult feat of going completely under her horse while going full speed. Chub Morgan, manager and veteran of many rodeos, holds the fastest record of all time in wild steer bulldogging, having caught three steers in the remarkable time of 15 1/2 seconds at Sumas, Washington September 3, 1928. A percentage of the proceeds from the show will be donated to the local fire department.

Owen Writes Second Las Vegas Letter to Mr. and Mrs. Los Angeles

L. A. Community Analyst Submits Another of Series Being Published in Coast Papers About Boom.

The purpose of these "Open Letters" is to tell the truth, as I see it, about Boulder Dam, Los Angeles and Las Vegas.

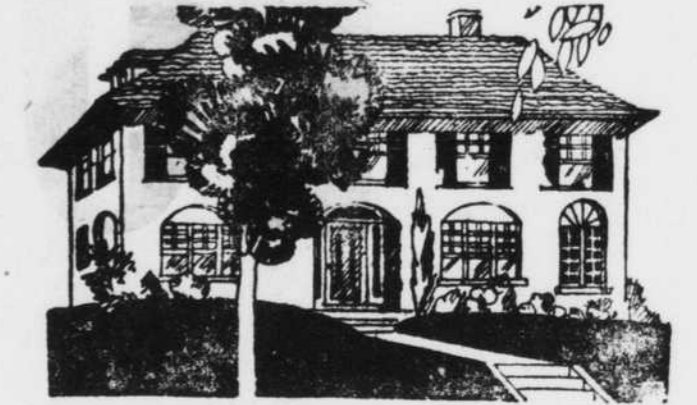
