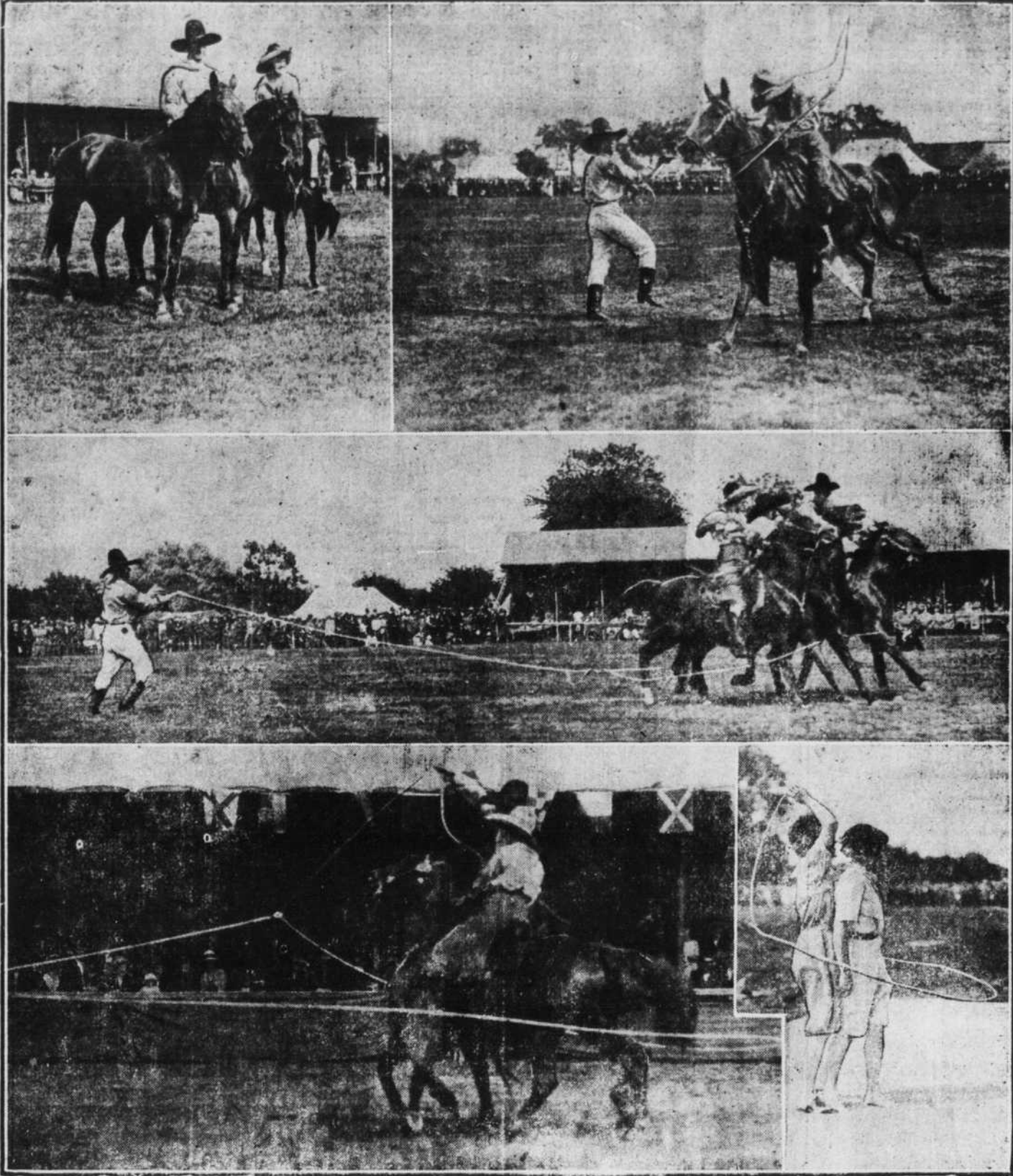

## Here's How They'll Look At Rodeo



When the cowboys and cowgirls with their ponies get into action at the Boulder Dam Rodeo in this city on April 6 and 7 they'll appear pretty much as those shown in these pictures, which were taken at the last Rodeo given in Madison Square Garden, New York City, last September. Most of the performers shown here will be entered in the rodeo in Las Vegas.

The top picture to the reader's left shows Pete Vandermere, protégé of the Prince of Wales and Champion of Canada, with his horse. Top to reader's right is Johnny Snyder roping Paris Williams' horse going full tilt. Middle picture shows Snyder catching a group of horses with riders. Lower left, Skeeter Bill Robbins and Dorothy Morrell trick roping, and lower right Bonnie Gray and Dorothy Morrell trick roping.

That expense was of no moment in staging the mammoth rodeo sponsored by the local fire department, to be held here April 6 and 7, is shown in the preliminary preparations which have been made by C. M. "Chub" Morgan, manager of the organization.

"More than \$2,000 has been expended to date to give Las Vegas the greatest exhibition of Western equestrian skill in her history," said Morgan today.

"This money has been spent in advertising the Desert City of Destinies of other states, and in the surrounding territory, as well as for the event itself.

"We believe Las Vegas fortunate to secure this great aggregation of riding stars who have performed before world-wide audiences, since the organization will be booked solid for a year after April 10."

The fire department will receive 10 per cent of the net funds over cost of production, and according to Fire Chief Case, these funds will be used for very necessary equipment in the club house, and for the benefit of sick and injured firemen.

**Skilled Woman Rider**

Among the outstanding performers will be Paris Williams, noted woman rider whose skill, grace, and daring have attracted the attention of thousands, some of whom are famous personages in European capitals. Miss Williams is the Champion Woman "Scratch" rider of the world, and holds many other titles, as well as commendation in the metropolitan community from various metropolitan newspapers.
