Kuck, Premier Weightman, Succumbs to Farm Appeal

LOS ANGELES, April 2. (AP)—John Kuck is going back to farming.

The big blond product of the Kansas wheat fields who, during the 1928 Olympic games, pyramid-ed the long impregnable world's shot put record to 52 feet 11-16 inches, plans to again shoulder the farm chores he has done almost every summer. He will return to his father's farm near Wilson, Kansas, at the close of the 1929 track season to help gather the crops.

Although his fame as a weight man already had spread, Kuck, then a high school student, would not try out for the 1924 Olympics because he "had to stay home and help harvest the wheat." The tousel haired giant, however, went to Amsterdam last year as a member of Uncle Sam's athletic troupe. In a dramatic last chance leave, he bested an earlier world's mark set up by Herman Brix, also of the American team, to win the shotput crown.

Kuck's return to the farm will not mean that he no longer will interest himself in athletics. To the contrary, he says that he may attend Kansas university next fall. The weight star, who attended Kansas State Teachers' college for one year, has another year of college eligibility left. He is now but 23 years of age.

Kuck's record breaking started during his interscholastic days at Wilson, Kansas, high school. He competed in the national interscholastic championships at Chicago in 1924, winning both the shotput and javelin events, and setting up a new record in each.

Both Kuck and Brix now are competing under the colors of the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Although on the same team there exists between them keen rivalry, and each meet in which they appear marks a friendly renewal of the battle that was waged between them for the Olympic games' honors. They will represent the club in the national championships to be staged in Denver, Colo., in July.

The dual appearances of these two noted weightmen provide an interesting comparison of their respective shot putting styles. Both are big and rugged, but Brix, former University of Washington weight ace, is a bit heavier set than Kuck. Brix's low backward crouch is considerably lower than that employed by Kuck in heaving the iron ball. Kuck depends on his massive shoulders and greatly developed wrist action to put the shot, while Brix uses a hip drive as the pivot of his heaves.
