### CREDIT DUE CORRADETTI ON NEW BUILDING

The Vegas Cleaning Works has been an important part of Las Vegas so long that we forget that it once had a humble beginning. In 1916 Al Corradetti opened a clothes cleaning department in connection with the Troy Steam Laundry, going into the business for himself in 1919.

For about two years the Vegas Cleaning Works was located in the old Lillis building on Fremont street where the Adcock store now is. It was while in this location that Al suffered a disaster which nearly ended his career. He was terribly burned by an explosion of gasoline and thereafter lay for months in the Las Vegas hospital. His legs were almost shriveled to nothing and it seemed impossible that he should ever walk again. But Al's indomitable fortitude at last conquered and he was able to set about for the second time building the foundations for a business. In 1921 he moved to the present location in the Overland Hotel building and from that date the business has grown steadily. He was obliged to build a concrete workshop on his property on Main street, and this building is incorporated in the greater structure which Mr. Corradetti in cooperation with the Troy Steam Laundry is erecting and which has a frontage of 150 feet on Main street, the largest business block in the city.

Already an important factor in the city's industries, Al Corradetti is looking into the future with a clear vision in the effort to meet the keen demands which will be created with the certain growth of Las Vegas.
