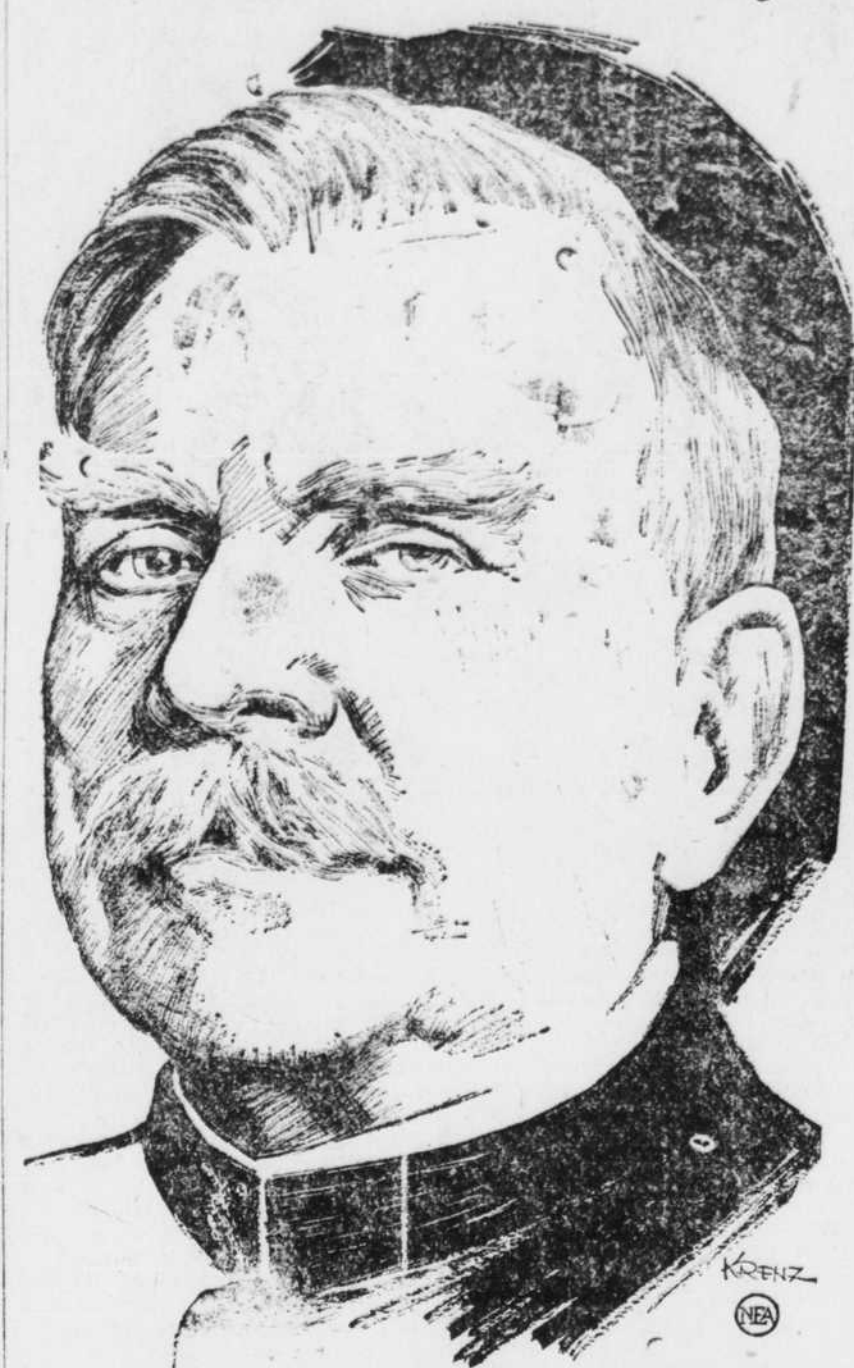


**CHEVORLET DELIVERIES SHOW INCREASE**

By SUE McNAMARA (Associated Press Feature Writer) WASHINGTON, April 9. (AP)—An outdoor family is that of the new attorney general, William D. Mitchell. And no member of it more thoroughly enjoys outdoors sports and excursions than Mrs. Mitchell.

She accompanies her husband and two sons on camping trips to mountains and lakes. She goes ice boating, tobogganing and skating with them. They have camped in the Rockies, making the trip with pack horses.

Playing golf and riding are other diversions Mrs. Mitchell enjoys. While they have lived in Washington for three and a half years, or since Mr. Mitchell was made collector general, they still maintain their summer home at White Bear Lake, Minn., and expect to return there this summer.

One son, William, 25, practices law in St. Paul, occupying the same offices his father had. He is the third William Mitchell of the family to practice law in that city, his grandfather having been justice of the supreme court of Minnesota 29 years. Another son, Bancroft, 23, is attending the Harvard school of business administration. Both boys attended Princeton university and Harvard graduate schools. Neither is married.

The strong family ties and love of home is evident the moment one steps over the doorstep of the Mitchell home in Washington. King Coal, a black spaniel, welcomes one at the door along with Worthington, the butler. Coal makes one feel right at home and does a lot of tail wagging while Worthington goes to an-

nounce the caller. The living room is long, pleasant and sunny, with windows looking out on trees and ravine. Deep, easy chairs have shelves of books within easy reach and lights at just the right angle. Pictures of the two sons are prominent. There is a piano, for Mrs. Mitchell both plays and sings, although social duties since coming to Washington have interfered to some extent with her music.

She is a woman interested in life and in people. Her good health shows in her sparkling brown eyes and her keen interest in all manner of subjects.

Social service work always has been intensely interesting to her. The Y. W. C. A., the Community chest and similar activities claimed much of her time in St. Paul. For several years she was president of the Y. W. C. A. and was one of the two women members of the committee of 30 of the St. Paul association of public and business affairs. Since coming to Washington she has continued her philanthropic work and now is on the board of the Y. W. C. A. and the Neighborhood house.

**PRAGUE AIR BEACON IS VISIBLE 50 MILES**

WASHINGTON, April 11. (AP)—A new airways beacon, visible for 50 miles, has been installed at the Prague, Czechoslovakia, airport, the department of commerce has been advised by its consul at Prague. The new beacon, 141 feet high, is of 2,750.00 candle power and is the main unit of complete night flying equipment installed. The seven storied structure was erected at a cost of \$25,000.

**IOWA PROFESSOR HEARS ATOMS DANCE**

IOWA CITY, Iowa, April 11. (AP)—Frolics of the atoms have been broadcast by WSUI, University of Iowa station, by means of an amplifying device designed by Edward P. Tyndall, professor of physics.

By magnifying the sound 35,000 times, Professor Tyndall has made audible the movement of atoms in an iron bar under the influence of a magnet. Iron magnetizes "discontinuously" and the atoms dance about quite lively, judging by the clicking noise they make. What determines the order of their response to magnetization is not known.

RIO DE JANEIRO, April 11. (AP)—Brazilian exports in 1928 were worth \$486,000,000 imports by more than \$33,000,000. Products showing an increase over 1927 included coffee \$35,000,000; frozen meat \$5,000,000 and hides, manganese and fruit. Decreases were recorded in rice, sugar, rubber, cotton and dried meats.

PARIS, April 11. (AP)—The Fredrick Chopin Association is making arrangements to transfer the remains of the great composer to the Wawel of Cracow, the pantheon of Poland. Chopin was born in Mazovia in 1810 but lived in Paris after attaining his majority.

MUDKIN, Manchuria, April 11. (AP)—The Japanese owned South Manchurian Railway company is planning to add a steel plant to its iron works at Anshan to refine a portion of its pig iron output into steel. Three experts of its staff are to inspect the steel plants of American and Europe.
