Los Angeles Architect, Builder, Formerly of New York, Says City With Greatest Growth Place for Him.

To 2 cups cold roast meat, chopped, add 1 cup bread crumbs, 1 chopped onion, 1/2 teaspoon chopped parsley and same of chopped celery leaves. Beat 2 eggs and mix with all ingredients. Form into balls, roll in crumbs and fry in deep hot fat.

Rice and Swiss Cheese
Boil 1 cup rice and place a layer in buttered baking dish, season with salt and red pepper; add a layer of grated Swiss cheese, more rice and cheese; cover to top with milk and bake until the milk is absorbed.

Salad Eileen
To fresh cottage cheese add 2 tbs. chopped chives, salt, pepper and cream to moisten. Mold in cups, turn out on salad plate, press a tiny sardine into each mold; garnish with cream and stuffed olives and serve very cold.

Angel Sandwich
Cut slices of angel food cake about 1/2 inch thick, spread between them a filling of whipped cream mixed with chopped nuts.

COONEL AYRES REDUCES SUCCESS TO 4 POINTS

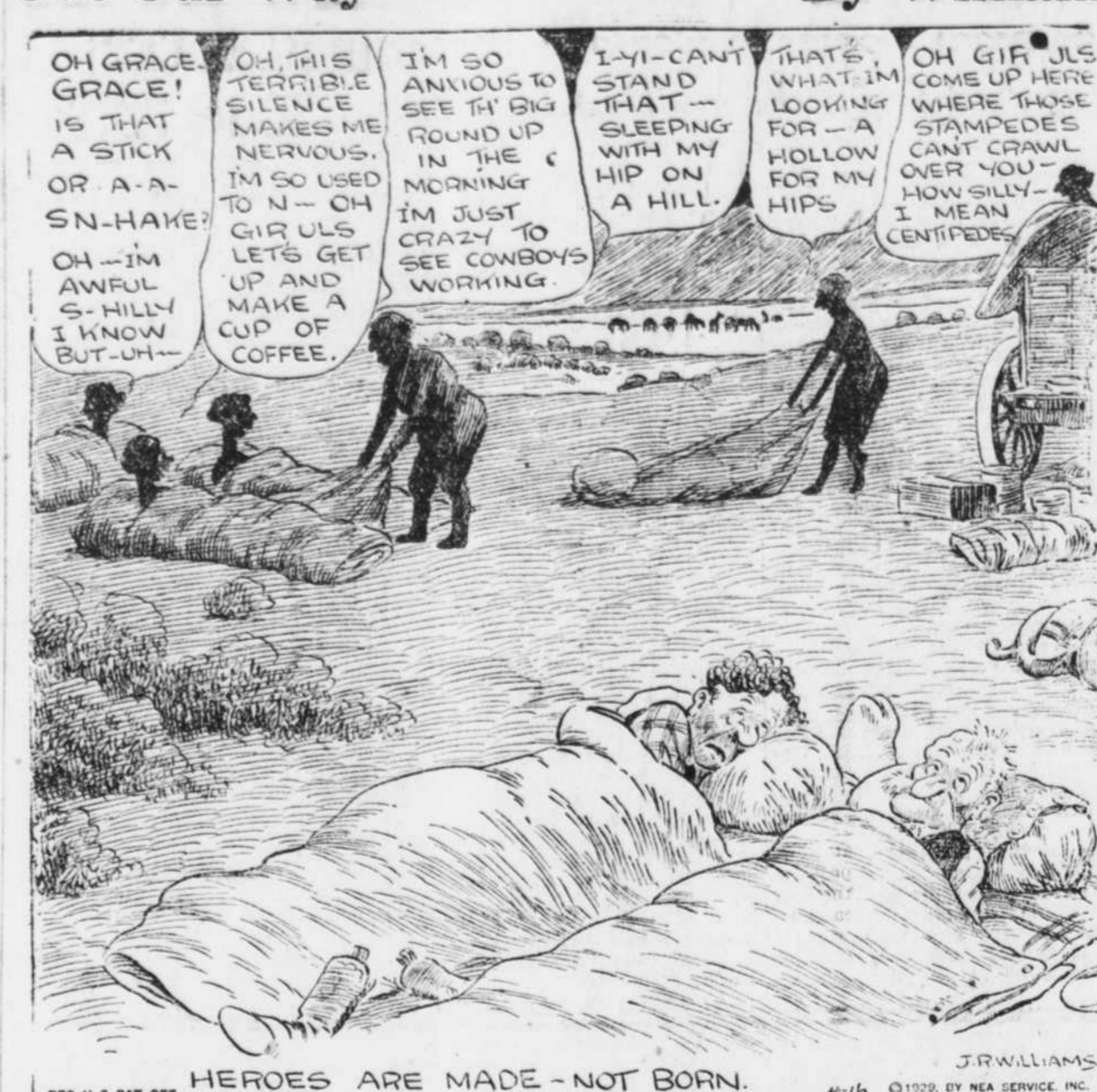

SOUTH SEA ISLANDERS TO SEE FIRST AIRPLANE

OAKLAND, Cal., April 20. (AP)—Certain South Sea Islanders are to get their first glimpse of an airplane when Franklin W. Wakefield, world traveler who has been in charge of an American trading station in the Southern Pacific for 15 years arrives in French Oceania with his new American plane.

Wakefield says he bought the plane to commute between his 50 outlying island posts in the South Sea. A California pilot, whom Wakefield has taken with him, will fly the trader between his stations until he learns to pilot the plane himself.

Flying conditions in the islands are ideal most of the year. Wakefield says, and the island beaches are natural airports. His longest jump will be 100 miles to Papete, the largest isle in the group, which has a population of 35,000.

ARKANSAS DOG RACES BANNED BY GOVERNOR

MARION, Ark., April 20. (AP)—Hope for revival of greyhound racing in Arkansas and re-opening of the \$93,000 Mid-South kennel club were dashed when Governor Farwell vetoed a legislative act permitting pari-mutuel betting.

The greyhound plant, located across the Mississippi river from Memphis, Tenn. had operated only two weeks when it was closed by state authorities enforcing laws against gaming. That was late in 1926, and the track has been idle since.

Many legal battles ensued, but the state won all the skirmishes over the legality of racing and pari-mutuel betting.

AIR MAIL SIREN WARNS LATE LETTER WRITERS

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., April 20. (AP)—An electric siren to notify air mail patrons of the arrival and departure of mail planes has been installed at the Hotel Patten here.

Operated by wire through a telephone switchboard at the airport, the siren is sounded here 15 minutes after the departure of the northbound plane from Atlanta, warning that there is yet time to post air mail at the post-office and get it aboard.

The siren is blown again 20 minutes before the ship reaches here to signify that only that much time is left in which to dispatch mail to the plane by special messenger.

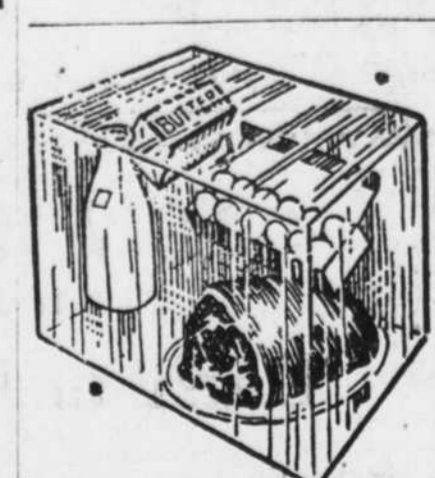
