POTOSI MINE WILL RENEW PRODUCTION

Mill at Mine to Begin Operations; Hundred Ton Flotation Plant Will Be Installed.

With a history as colorful as any mine in the west and a production record of millions of dollars, the old Potosi mine has been taken over by a strong company, and will again take its place among the producers of Southern Nevada.

In the hands of the Associated Metals, Inc., this famous property in the Yellow Pine Mining district, Clark county, about 25 miles southwest of Las Vegas, will again be the scene of much activity.

Discovered by the Mormons in the early 50's, the Potosi was the second property in the state to have letters of patent. The patent itself was signed by Abraham Lincoln, then president of the United States.

The new company will be known as the Calumet and Arizona Mining Company.
