CONSERVATORY OF JAZZ MUSIC TO OPEN HERE

Jack Lorraine and Two of His Apaches to Teach by Quick Method; Concerts at Lorenzi's Planned.

A conservatory of jazz music will be started in Las Vegas by June 1, according to announcements made yesterday by Jack Lorraine, director of the orchestra known as Jack Lorraine and His Apaches, which plays nightly at Lorenzi's Resort.

Violin, short reed instrument, piano, traps and all stringed instruments will be taught by Lorraine, and Jack Balfe and Westley Dutton, two capable musicians who are associated with Lorraine's orchestra. The chart method will be used for beginners.

Balfe, who plays violin and baritone, recently directed an 18-piece Orpheum band at Kansas City, Missouri. He is an arranger and composer of notes, as well as teacher and musician, according to Lorraine. Balfe came to Las Vegas several weeks ago.

Saxophone Teacher
Westley Dutton, saxophone and clarinet artist, plays and teaches all reed instruments. He arrived in this city Monday from Chicago, where he was connected with the Edgewater Club an exclusive club in the Midwest metropolis.

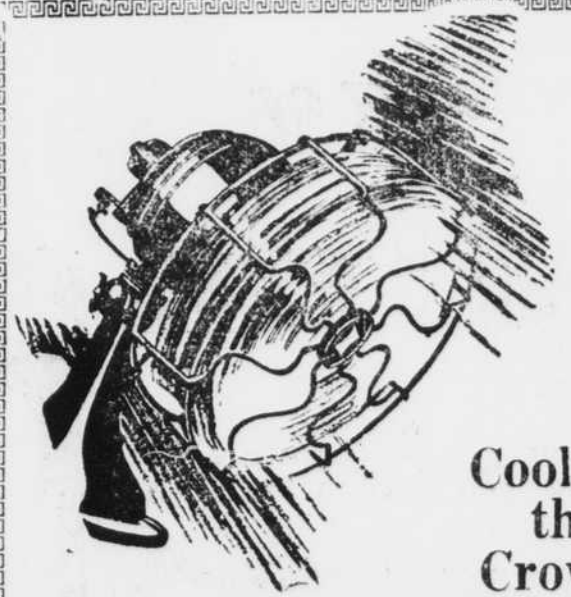
