He is beating all comers nowadays and seems in a fair way to take advantage of his long-sought crack at title-holder. Papienas' last bout with Dern was a little over a year ago, and it taught him how Dern secures his deadly airplane hold, with which he has wen so many bouts, so that the Greek believes he will be able to get a qu vkcriotic ,ghas able to get a quick victory, keeping out of the toils which spelled defeat for him before. Papionas won the first fall from Dern before Dern secured the "airplane" fall.

Wants Revenge In a letter received from Papionas Monday by Jack Harbertson. promoter of the bout, the Greek expressed great joy at having this opportunity to battle Dern again, especially in Las Vegas.

A letter from the Ogden grappler received Monday, assured Harbertson that Dern will come here directly from his bout in Portland, Oregon, with Ted Thye, whom he meets tomorrow night. Dern beat McConnell of Kansas City for two falls in 11 minutes in Salt Lake City last Friday.


