

PROBLEMS OF WIRE AND RADIO BOARD TACKLED BY SENATE

WASHINGTON, May 18, (AP)-With the senate committee on interstate commerce plunging into study of the voluminous bill of Senator Couzens, Michigan, for creation of a commission on communications, the move to regulate wire and wireless by one governmental agency is in full swing.

The bill, comprising 72 pages, takes the present radio act as a nucleus for a measure which would apply to all common carriers engaged in the transmission of intelligence by radio telegraph telephone and cable, and establish board with power similar to those of the interstate commerce com-

The commision would be composed of five members, one from each of the five zones designated under the present radio law. 




