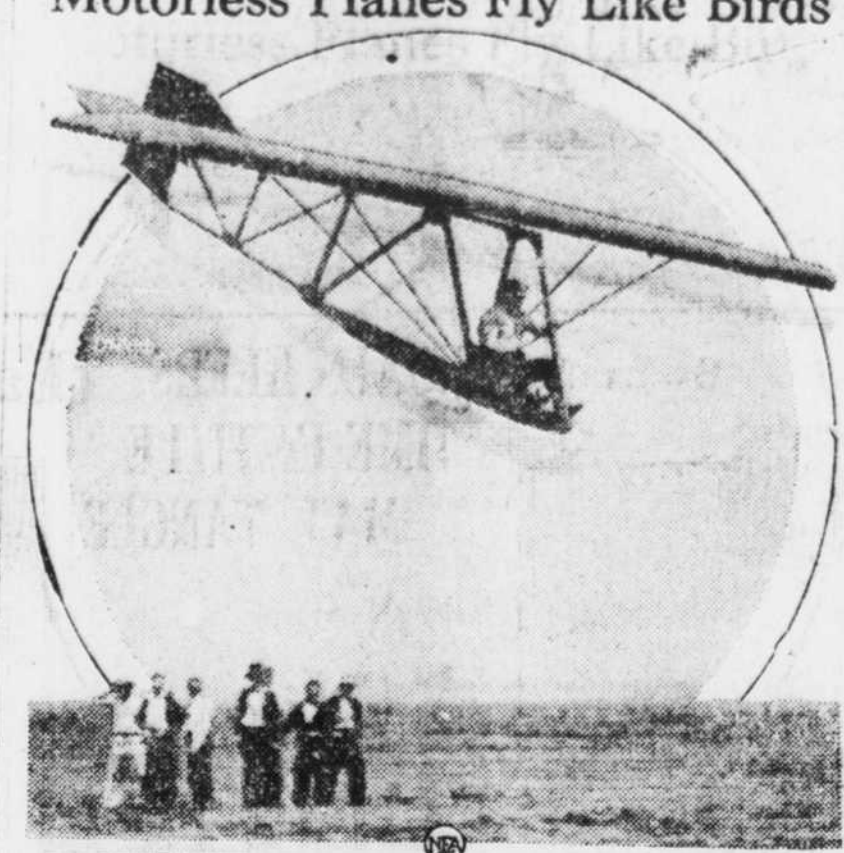

SUBJECTS ARE OUTLINED FOR REALTY MEET

Los Angeles Realtors Plan Special Train to National Convention in Boston June 28; Program Given.

Methods in operation in New York's recently established real estate securities exchange will be described by Charles C. Edwards, New York City, past president of the National Association of Real Estate Boards for Mortgage and Finance Division members in session at the Boston Convention of the National Association of Real Estate Boards, June 25 to 28.

Sydney Middleton, Chicago, vice-president of the American Bond and Mortgage company, will open the meetings of the mortgage and finance division on Wednesday morning, June 26, with an address on "Methods of Getting New Business." At the final session of these meetings, on Friday forenoon, June 28, Lawrence E. Mahan, St. Louis, president of the Real Estate Mortgage Trust company, will address the division on "Directing and Controlling the Operation of a Mortgage Corporation."

Practical Experiences. In line with its policy of consultation with experienced builders for the benefit of those just undertaking cooperative building projects, the Cooperative Apartment division has so planned its convention sessions as to include accounts of the practical experience of several of the country's most successful developers of cooperative projects.

Albert W. Swaine, Chicago president of the Chicago Real Estate Board and for several years chairman of the Cooperative Apartment division of the National Association, will address the division at its first meeting, Wednesday morning, June 26, on the minimum standards which have been outlined as essential by the consultation bureau, recently set up by the division to advise with builders of cooperative projects and to certify approved projects to the real estate buying public. At this same meeting David V. Sutton, New York City, of the firm of Sutton, Blagdon and Lynch, will speak on "The Organization of the Three Factors in an Initial Cooperative Development: Construction, Financing and Merchandising."

Apartment Houses. Lawrence E. Jones, developer of the cooperative garden project Alden Park, in Philadelphia, will have as his subject "Some Experiences in the Development and Sale of Cooperative Apartment Homes." Other speakers on the Cooperative Apartment division program include: Frank J. O'Brien, Chicago, of the firm of McKay and Poague.

PORTUGUESE ON WEST COAST IN RELIGIOUS RITES

"Pageant to the Holy Ghost" Celebrated Until July.

By GEORGE D. CRISSEY. United Press Staff Correspondent. SAN FRANCISCO, May 18. (UP)—This is the time of the year when a bit of the old world seems to leap the Atlantic and settle for a brief spell in California.

From now until July or thereabouts the thousands of Portuguese and Azorians in this state will return thanks to the Holy Ghost because many years ago he interceded and saved a race from starvation.

Sometimes the celebration is called that of the Pentecost and frequently it is referred to as a pageant to the Holy Ghost, but always the periods of festivity are religious in nature, forming a bit of Catholicism distinct to the Portuguese people.

In the fertile valleys of California there are many settlements of Portuguese, most of them being Azorians. The celebrations always are joyous occasions and are climaxed by high mass in the local Catholic church. A sermon in Portuguese also is preached.

The story is that many years ago the Portuguese were starving and the gracious Queen Isabel, grieving for her stricken subjects, pledged her crown to the Holy Ghost if he would save them. It is related in Portuguese folklore that two great ships, loaded with wheat, were cast upon the sands of the coast of Portugal, and the famine was at an end.

ARNTZ FIGHTS FOR TARIFF ON LOW GRADE ORE

WASHINGTON, May 17. (Special)—At a night session of the ways and means committee on May 16, members of congress from twenty states presented a renewed appeal for half a cent increase in the tariff on manganese ore and protection for other low grade ores.

States having substantial deposits of manganese ore were represented at the hearing. The appeal was presented by a committee composed of Congressman William Williamson of South Dakota, chairman, Congressman Samuel S. Arntz of Nevada and Congressman Scott Leavitt of Montana.

Congressman Leavitt was chosen chief spokesman of the committee because of the large deposits being actively operated in Montana.
