## 'Spooky' Scene, Chase Across Icy River, Feature of 'Topsy and Eva'

A shivery graveyard scene at night, with spooks—a chase across a river of floating ice, with bloodhounds in pursuit—Topsy's race through the snowdrifts—these are but a few of the hilarious scenes in "Topsy and Eva," the Duncan Sisters' first screen appearance, which is scheduled to show at El Patio theater Friday and Saturday nights this week.

"Topsy and Eva" is a comedy film adapted from Rosetta and Vivian Duncan's famous musical comedy of the same name which played to capacity audiences during its recent tour of the United States.

Many original and unusual situations mark this picture as an "epic of fun." The graveyard scene in which "Topsy" wanders after escaping Simon Legree is said to be one of the most amusing sequences ever photographed.
