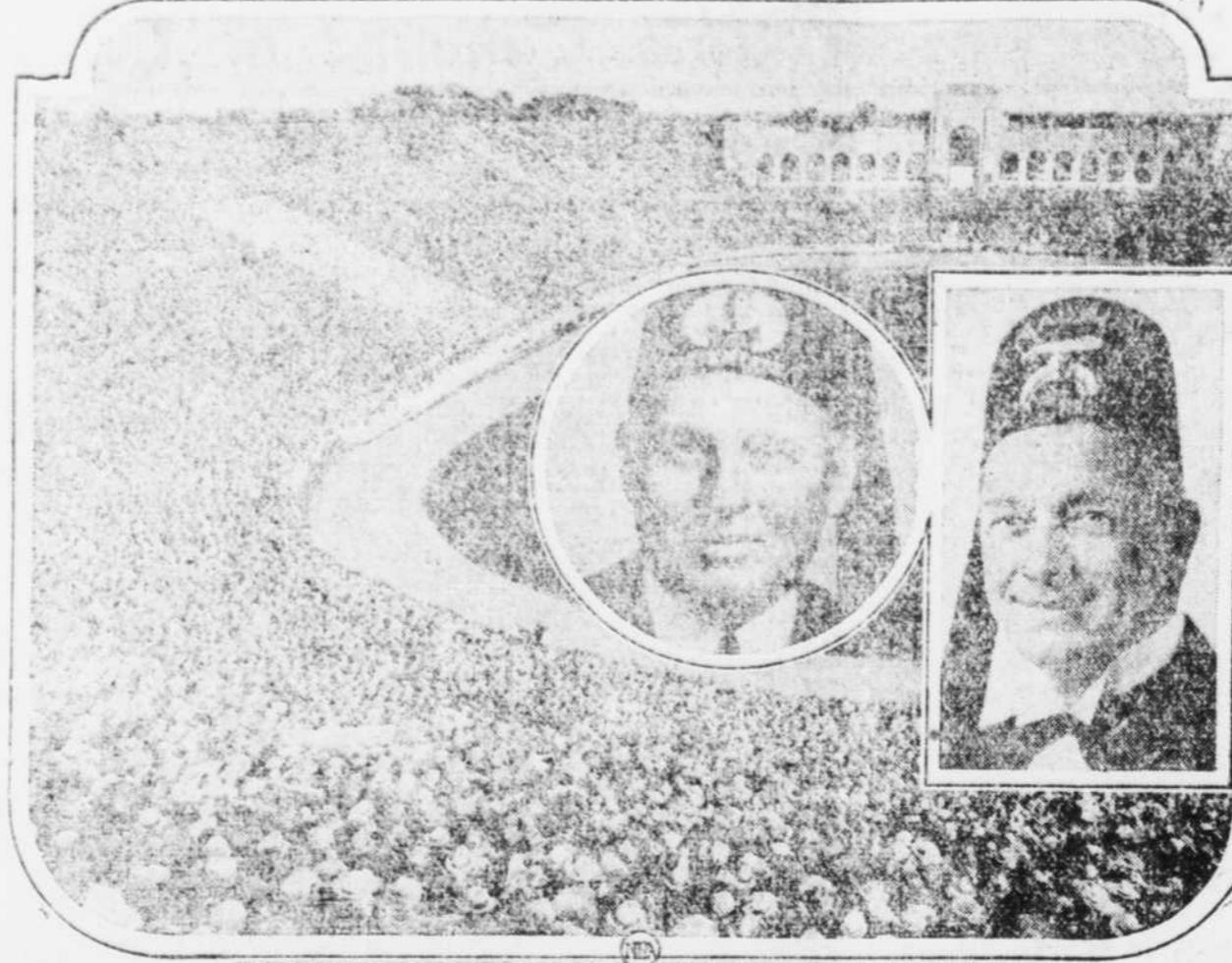

Tri-State Meet To Be Informal

Donovan Invites Delegates to Dinner for Opening of Boulder Confab.

WASHINGTON, May 27. (UP)—Instead of plunging immediately into the tri-state conference on the contested clauses of the proposed lower basin compact, Arizona, California and Nevada Colorado River commissions will hold an informal and unusual meeting Tuesday.

Col. William Donovan, former attorney general, who presided at the past conferences and who will preside over this final attempt at agreement, invited senators of all seven of the states involved in the project to meet with the commissioners of the seven states at luncheon in his home.

Ray Lyman Wilbur, secretary of the interior and commissioner of reclamation Elwood Mead, also will be guests.

Complete commissions of California and Arizona, the two states which must compromise if Arizona is to be a party of the seven-state compact when the Swing-Johnson bill goes into effect June 21 will be present. Other states to be represented by the commission chairman, and Gov. Frank Emerson, of Wyoming also will attend.

New Tariff On Lumber From N. W. To Vegas

PORTLAND, Ore., May 29. (UP)—H. E. Lounsbury, general freight agent of the Union Pacific system, Portland, has announced new tariffs on lumber from Pacific Northwest points to Las Vegas, Nevada, where construction of the Boulder Dam by the federal government will entail consumption of millions of feet of lumber.

Lounsbury said it would require at least forty days before the new rates will become effective. He said, must be filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission, Washington, D. C., thirty days prior to action.

Rates Explained
Present rates on lumber from Pacific Northwest points, Lounsbury said, are as follows: From points of origin on the Union Pacific System lines, as Las Vegas is located on the Los Angeles & Salt Lake unit of the system.

The present rates are: From Boise, 50 cents per hundred; Baker and La Grange, Oregon, 50 cents; Seckane, Washington, 55 cents; Condon, Bend and Portland, 60 cents; and Tacoma, Seattle and Grays Harbor, 65 cents.

Changes Given
Instructions have been issued by Lounsbury to publish the following through rates on lumber to Las Vegas: From Eureka and Westwood, California, 55 1/2 cents per hundred; from Weed and McCloud, California, and Klamath Falls and Medford, Oregon, 55 cents; Grants Pass, 59 cents; Lystul, Oregon, 61 cents.

Points on the Southern Pacific north of Lystul and south of Portland, 62 1/2 cents; Vernonia, Oregon, 62 1/2 cents; points north of Portland; Seattle, Tacoma and intermediate points, including Longview and Mills on the C. C. and and C. and Neahum Valley railroads, 62 1/2 cents.

Embezzlement Is Charged Because He Wouldn't Wed

Colorado River Shows Big Rise

Stream Swollen by Wyoming, and Utah Waterheads May Reach 33-foot Danger Line

PHOENIX, May 29. (UP)—Increasing runoff of the Wyoming and Utah waterheads into the Colorado River indicates that a 100,000 second foot crest and a depth of twenty-eight and one-tenth feet will be reached at Yuma June 7, according to the local weather bureau.

Today's report suggests the possibility of the Colorado river approaching, though not necessarily reaching, the thirty-three foot danger line.
