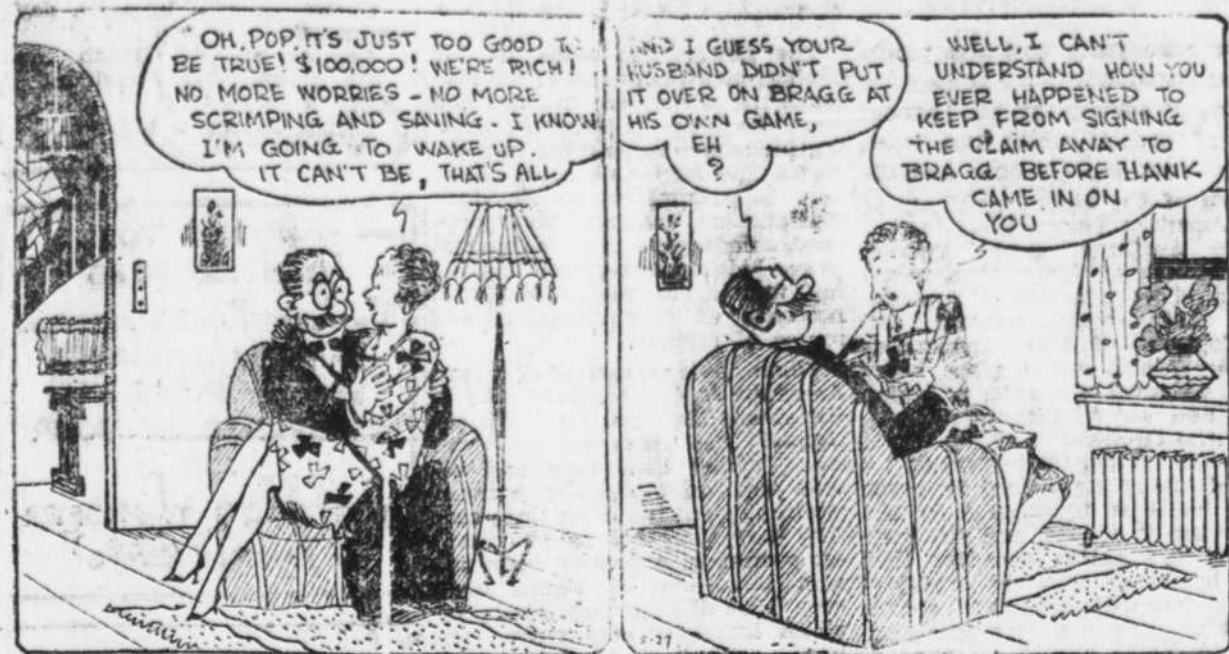

Vacation Wires Bring Problems

Western Union Spends Much Money to Meet Needs of Summer Excursionists.

NEW YORK, May 29. The task of handling the nation's vacation telegrams requires months of preparation, the expenditure of hundreds of thousands of dollars and the training of hundreds of persons.

Each year the telegraph companies must open thousands of seasonal offices in various resort centers scattered from the Atlantic to the Pacific coast. These offices must be manned by trained and experienced operators. They must be equipped to handle a tremendous volume of business for just a few months of each year. Furthermore, it is frequently necessary, when the influx of visitors to any particular section and locality is unusually large, to build many extra miles of pole line and to expand the wire facilities in that section.

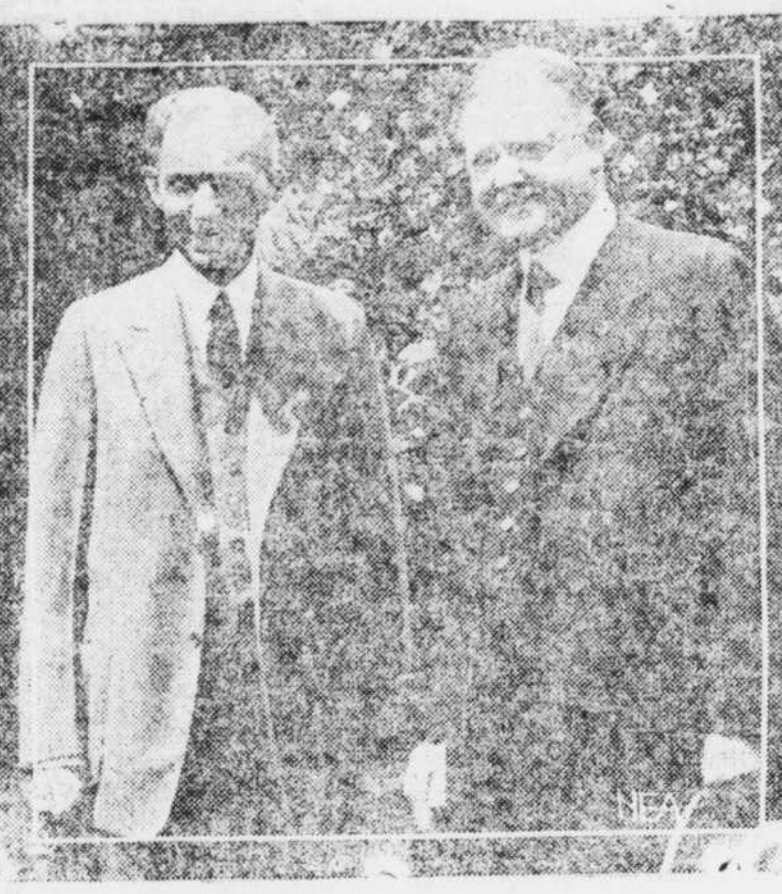
This year the Western Union will handle a large portion of its vacation telegraph business automatically with the new typewriter-like machine which will replace the old-fashioned key and sender.

Another of the problems which annually confronts the telegraph company at this time of the year is the necessity for providing adequate paging facilities at railway stations, steamboat landings, bus stations and other points where telegrams are delivered to transients. Special messengers must be provided for this work. They are trained to speak loudly and to enunciate clearly so that when they are seeking Mr. Jones their "telegram for Mr. Jones" sounds like "Mr. Jones" and not "Mr. Bones." This year the paging service will be extended to include airports where passenger planes take off and land. At some of the larger airports, such as the new Municipal Airport at Newark, N. J., the Western Union has already opened offices.
