HIGGINS LOS ANGELES, June 3 .- Preliminary arrangements for the organization of the Boulder Dam Gold Placers, Inc., have been perfected here with Mark Musgrove. former mining commissioner of the state of Nevada, as president. Associated with Mr. Musgrove will be a streng group of local financial interests. For many years Mr. Musgrove has been interested in the expicitation of the suriferous gravel deposits at the mouth of the Grand Canyon along the Colorado River in both Arizona and Nevada, and between the mouth of the Grand Canyon and Virgin Canyon. "The existence of extensive goldbearing gravel in this nautral catch basin has long been known but never exploited on a scale commensurate with their extent and Mr. Musgrove says. "There is a natural site for a debris dam just above the beginming of these deposits which we will employ for the generation of electricity for our own uses and for hydraulicking the high bars alogn the river. The low bars will be worked by dredges.' The company will maintain its
