Crabfluke Salad Relish Sandwiches

Green and White Cream Sandies

## Crabfluke Salad, Serving Eight

1 1/2 cups crabflakes.  
1 cup diced celery.  
1 cup diced cucumbers.  
2 hard cooked eggs, diced.  
1 teaspoon salt.  
1/4 teaspoon paprika.  
1/4 cup mayonnaise.  
Mix and chill the ingredients. Serve in cups of crisp lettuce leaves.

## Relish Sandwiches

16 slices crabfluke bread.  
1/2 cup cream cheese.  
4 tablespoons chopped pimentos.  
4 tablespoons chopped olives.  
3 tablespoons mayonnaise.  
Mix the cheese, pimentos, olives and mayonnaise. Spread on the slices of bread. Arrange sandwich fashion.

## Lemon Coconut Cookies Three Dozen

1/2 cup fat.  
1 cup sugar.  
3 tablespoons lemon juice.  
1 tablespoon grated lemon rind.  
1/2 teaspoon salt.  
1 teaspoon vanilla.  
3 tablespoons cream.  
2-3 cup coconut.  
3 cups flour.  
1 teaspoon baking powder.  
Cream the fat and sugar. Add the eggs and beat for two minutes. Add the rest of the ingredients and drop portions, three inches apart on greased baking sheets. (Flatten the cookies with the broad side of a knife.) Bake in a moderate oven for 10 minutes.

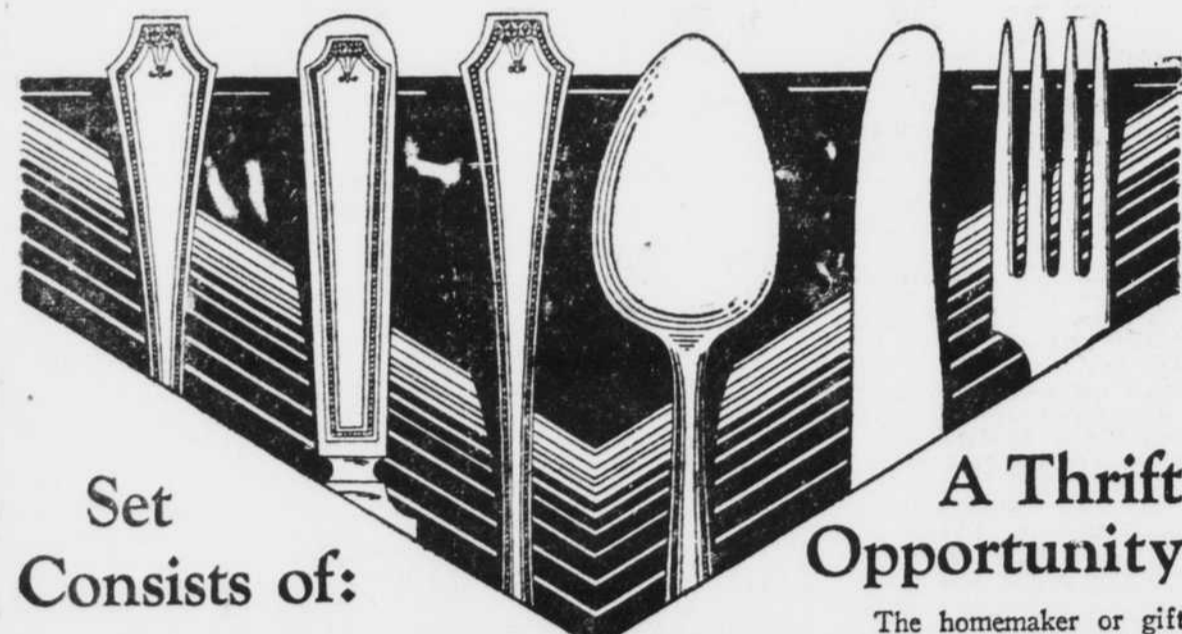
