Senator Names New Secretary

Senator Tasker L. Oddie of Nevada, chairman of the committee on mines and mining, announces the appointment of H. N. Lawrie as secretary.

Mr. Lawrie, upon graduating from the school of mines of Columbia University, New York, in 1905, carried on a general consulting geological practice throughout the western states, with headquarters at Portland, Oregon. In 1913 he succeeded in obtaining the enactment by the Ore. legislature of the bill to create the Ore. Bureau of Mines and Geol. Commission, and served as chairman of the commission until 1919, when he came to Washington to accept the position of Economist to the American Mining Congress.

For a number of years Mr. Lawrie served the Portland (Oregon) Chamber of Commerce as Washington representative, and in that capacity became intimately familiar with the legislative problems of the west, covering agriculture, reclamation, forestry, mining, rivers and harbors, and maritime developments. As special expert to the United States Shipping Board, Mr. Lawrie made two reports covering the economic importance of the merchant marine, both of which were published by Congress and used as a basis for merchant marine legislation. In these reports Mr. Lawrie pointed out that the interior states were more dependent upon the American merchant marine in reducing transportation costs to foreign markets than were the seaboard states.

When the Senate commission of gold and silver inquiry was created, under the chairmanship of Senator Oddie, Mr. Lawrie was appointed as economist in charge of the investigation. As one of the results of this investigation, the American silver producers were brought together and formed a national organization to safeguard their interests. The commission also made an extensive investigation into European currency and finance, which expedited the return to more normal conditions in the European countries, resulting in new silver coins and in safeguarding the maintenance of the gold standard. This work was favorably received by government officials and many of the leading economists and bankers both here and abroad.

With an extensive practical experience in assisting in the solution of the problems of western development over so long a period, Mr. Lawrie is also familiar with the economic needs of the State of Nevada, and with an intimate knowledge of the legislative procedure, he should be of great assistance to Senator Oddie in carrying out a constructive program for the development of the State.



WASHINGTON, June 11 (U.P.)—Cleveland is preparing for the 1929 National Air Races which will begin there late in August when more than 1,000 planes—Army, Navy and commercial—will be on hand.

A new \$10,000,000 auditorium will provide exhibition space for the 250 builders of airplanes and accessories who are expected to place their wares in view there. AA walk through this hall should provide a kaleidoscopic glance at the myriads of new inventions and innovations which have entered the aviation realm within the last year.

Five cross country events have been scheduled for the 10-day meet. These include a race from California, for women a non-stop derby from Portland, Ore., an international race from a Canadian city to be announced later, and two others, one from Florida and one from Texas.

As a tribute to the memory of the late Ambassador Myron T. Herrick the French government has been invited to send a formation of its crack military fliers to Cleveland to participate in the races. Cleveland was the home city of the late ambassador.

Mail planes soon may be winging their way from Louisville to Dallas, cutting a diagonal across a territory roughly a thousand miles square which is now bounded by other mail routes.

Representatives of a number of cities to be served by the proposed route were to meet in Louisville with Washington officials on June 5 to discuss establishment of the line. A committee to present plans of operation to the President's Interdepartmental Committee on Airways was to be appointed.

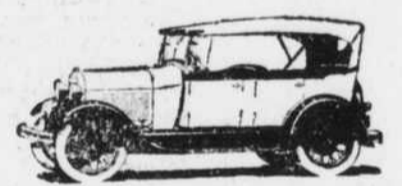
