Anti-Drink Campaign in Mexico Gains Momentum Through States

By JOHN LLOYD (Associated Press Staff Writer) MEXICO CITY, June 14, (AP)—President Portes Gil's campaign to rid Mexico of the drink evil has become one of the chief topics of discussion throughout the country and one of the principal subjects of legislation.

The president's appeal to state governments to second his endeavors has met with ready response in the form of orders restricting the sale and consequently the consumption of alcoholic liquors, as well as regulating the number of saloons.

Governor Raymundo Enriquez of Chiapas has instructed the state treasurer to establish so heavy a tax on intoxicating drinks that their manufacture will be unprofitable. This measure, in addition to discouraging manufacture of liquor, is calculated to obliterate the saloons to charge prices beyond the reach of the average man.

Governor Enriquez also has ordered that the saloons be forced to pay increased taxes, hoping

NEW YORK, June 14, (AP)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh will pilot the plane which will leave Los Angeles July 8 to inaugurate the trans-continental air-mail service to New York, it was announced here today.

Lindbergh will fly only to Clovis, N. M., officials of the Transcontinental Air Transport said. Previously it had been announced the Colonel would pilot the plane which will leave New York for the west the same day. Lindbergh is technical adviser for the air transport company.

Will Rogers will be one of Lindbergh's passengers from Los Angeles. The humorist bought the first ticket and will make the complete trans-continental trip.

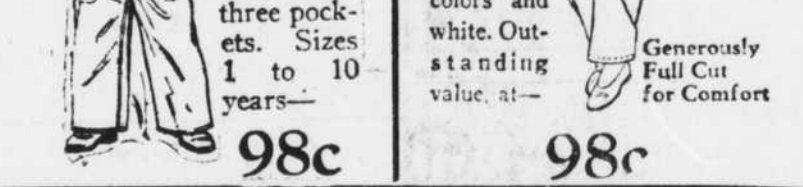
