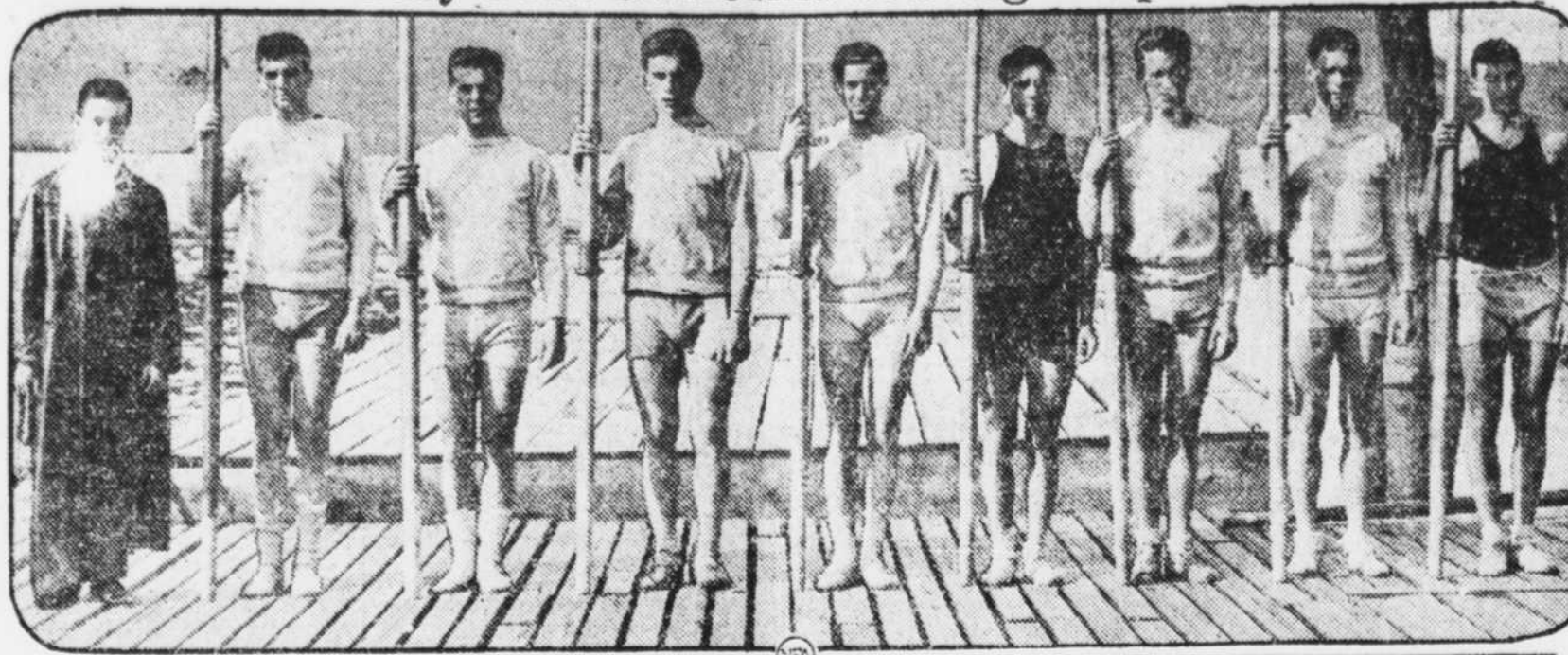

He is especially interested in an effort to bring about the early construction of the highway from Las Vegas to the dam site as part of the Boulder Dam project.

First Air-Rail Trip Is Made

LOS ANGELES, June 17 (AP)—A group of pioneer trans-continental air rail passengers headed by Mabel Walker Willebrandt, former Assistant U. S. District attorney general, arrived here by train today after a trip from New York. Marking the opening of the Universal Aviation Corporation-Santa Fe Railroad point line, Mrs. Willebrandt brought a message from Mayor Walker of New York to Mayor Cryer of Los Angeles and a bottle of Atlantic Ocean water.

The trip required less than three days, after leaving New York City by train late Friday, flying from Cleveland to Garden City, Kansas and finishing the trip by rail.

"This air travel is wonderful," Mrs. Willebrandt, recently named to an important position with an air transit company, said, "we traveled comfortably. I have all the sleep I wanted."

Mrs. Willebrandt will visit here with her parents for three days after which she will return to New York in the same manner that she made the trip to the west coast.

Barber Shop to Be Open Again Soon

The Clawson-Tucker barber shop, which was damaged by the fire which raged in the rear of the Levy building last week, probably will be open again for business Thursday, according to Grover Clawson, one of the proprietors.

Mr. Levy, owner of the building, is in Las Vegas overseeing the repair of the damage done by the fire, and the insurance adjuster has completed his work on adjustment of the damage.

COPENHAGEN.—(AP)—Denmark's national wealth has doubled since 1907, according to official statistics. The country's net debt abroad is only 10 per cent of her wealth, so she owns 90 per cent of her fortune.

HONOLULU.—(AP)—A stranded whale recently provided the town of Waimea on the Island of Kauai with free meat for several days. The whale was 14 feet long and was dragged ashore from shallow water.

HAMBURG.—(AP)—The importation of Chinese eggs into Germany has increased at such a rate that a special warehouse has been created here to handle them. Three years ago 15,000,000 eggs came from the Orient. Last year the total was 27,000,000.

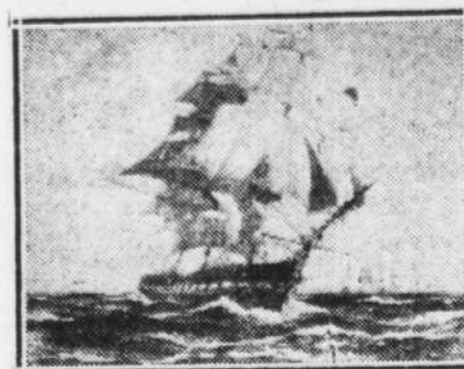
