WARM WELCOME

CLIMATIC CONTRAST

SECRETARY WILBUR and Commissioner Mead and party will be treated to an unusual contrast in climates today.

From the heat of the Black Canyon gorge on the Colorado River where the altitude is six hundred feet, they will be whisked, according to plans, quickly to the 8,000 foot altitude of Charleston Park where snowbanks linger into August and the chill of autumn is in the air.

Under the whispering pines the officials will cool off while they discuss with citizens some of the problems incidental to Boulder Dam construction which Las Vegas considers vital to her interests.

Coming back to Las Vegas in the cool of the evening our guests may think Las Vegas a rather delightful place after all.

The visitors also will have learned that the desert country has an ever changing variety of scene and climate. Incidentally they will learn that Charleston Park is one of the most glorious mountain regions in the west.

NEVADA AND POWER

AFTER ALL THE YEARS of confab over royalties and revenue and division of water and allocation of power from the Boulder Dam project the fact remains the same old fact that was recognized as paramount years ago—Nevada's chief interest in the project is to secure an allocation of power to serve her future needs.

The present needs of Nevada for power are almost nil. Our share is to be measured by our present necessity we will fare but poorly in the division of the benefits.

But, it is easy to recall, the upper basin states have plenty of water for present uses, yet by the terms of the Colorado River Compact their right to develop their resources in the years of the future were considered and approximately half the entire flow of the water of the Colorado River was set apart to them forever.

California, it was often pointed out, has ample water and ample power for present needs, but like Arizona she is seeking to provide for her future.

Nevada has one great permanent benefit to hope for from the Boulder Canyon development which is more important than royalty or revenue. That is her right under the law to share in power for her future needs.

A means must be found whereby Nevada can be secured in her rightful proportion of the Boulder Dam power, to take it as her development requires. The knowledge that cheap power is available will quickly produce the demand for it. But if all the power is to be transmitted for use in another state our development will be comparatively small.

The power problem as it pertains to Nevada can be worked out if those in official power will give it the consideration it deserves. It is by all odds the greatest necessity confronting our state today. The growth and prosperity of the entire state depend upon how it is settled.

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Pioneer, 98, Tells of Early Days at Fort Callville, 64 Years Ago

Ninety-eight years and one day old, one of Clark county's pioneers of all the pioneers sat in the Age office yesterday and told of how he helped build Fort Callville, about forty miles from this city on the Colorado River, 64 years ago, and how he drove over the almost trackless waste between here and Salt Lake City helping dispose of a huge stock of merchandise which failed to sell at the fort in those early days.

McGinnis is this pioneer's name, and he lives now at the county poor farm, having failed in his endeavor to obtain a government pension for his activity as an Indian fighter in the frontier days.
