SAN FRANCISCO, June 27.—(U.P.) William Harrison Bones, his whiskers flowing in the wind and two big tears glistening in his eyes, started back to Manila today.

From the foredeck of the army transport Meigs, as it steamed out of the Golden Gate, came floating back the farewell bleat of Bill—his goodbye to his owner, Secretary of State Henry L. Stimson.

Bill Bones wasn't wanted in this country. Customs officers and officials of the Department of Agriculture looked upon him with suspicion.

Keyes Accuser Is Under Arrest

LOS ANGELES, June 27. (U.P.)—Milton Pike, the owner of the little brown diary which helped to convict former District Attorney Asa Keyes and others on conspiracy to bribe charges, was held today under \$15,000 bond on a complaint accusing him of accepting money to change court testimony.

He was arrested late yesterday as he walked from a downtown hotel room where he just had conferred with Harold "Buddy" Davis, former chief trial deputy for Keyes, Davis, himself, must go to trial next Monday on counts similar to those against Keyes.

When he was taken into custody Pike had in his possession \$329 in marked bills, assertedly given him by Davis to influence Pike's testimony against Davis.

The arrest was inspired and planned by Davis. Davis avoided any contact with the district attorney's office in managing the arrest of Pike.

District Attorney Byron Fitts, who will direct the state's case against Davis, said that his investigators would go into the matter of Pike's arrest thoroughly.

"If it develops that Davis and others are seeking to harrass state witnesses, appropriate action will be taken," he said. "At the same time if it is found that Pike is guilty as charged this office will prosecute him to the utmost."

Pike said the entire thing was a "gigantic frameup to get me for my part in prosecuting Asa Keyes."

Asked how he came to be in possession of the money Pike said: "I know who put it in my pocket, all right."

The prisoner seemed not at all disturbed by his arrest. Pike was one of the two star state witnesses against Keyes.

He testified that he heard conversations relative to the Julian case in which Keyes and other members of his staff agreed to "let up" on the prosecution. He was expected to testify similarly against Davis.

Income Tax Net Gets Three More

LOS ANGELES, June 27. (U.P.)—The government's wholesale investigation of income tax returns from Hollywood today had reached the names of two more prominent motion picture figures.

The grand jury, after hearing evidence collected over the past several weeks, returned indictments accusing Raymond Griffith and Raymond McKee, actors, with making false returns.

A third true bill coming from the jury charged Edward Hayden, Hollywood tax counselor, with fraud in the preparation of the returns of the two film players.

Hayden already was under indictment on similar counts concerning other prominent screen actors.

Griffith specifically was accused of deducting \$1846.64 from his 1925 income of \$65,596.70 when only \$14,974.29 was legitimately deductible. Similarly in 1926 he was accused of deducting the amount of \$30,996.23 from a gross income of \$115,154.79 when only \$9,131.10 was deductible.

McKee, according to the indictment, paid a tax of only \$42.90 in 1925 on an income of \$27,445.71 when \$1068.63 should have been paid. In 1926 he assertedly paid only \$36.02 when he should have returned \$1881.06.

Hayden assertedly prepared the returns.

27 Million Plane Merger Formed

NEW YORK, June 28.—(U.P.)—The Curtis Airplane and Motor company and the Wright Aeronautical Company has agreed on terms for a merger for the manufacture of airplanes, making the new unit the largest airplane company in the United States.

C. Pays, president of the Curtis company confirmed the rumor of the consolidation, and the merger has combined assets of \$27,214,981.

The new corporation it was said, would also take over the ten companies controlled by Hoyt-Wright, and the Keys-Curtiss group, and subsequently take in the Travel-Air manufacturing company and the Maude aircraft company, making the total assets \$100,000,000.
