## Championship Mat Bouts For Friday, Planned

Dern May Meet Japanese Jiu Jitsu Champion; Papionas, Kotsوناتas Greek Champion Match Sought.

A world championship wrestling match in which the Japanese Jiu Jitsu champion, Yakiyama, would seek to unthrone Ira Dern, of Salt Lake City, light heavyweight champion of the world, will be on tap for visiting and local fans at 6 p.m. July 5 if Matchmaker A. B. Mortenson has succeeded in landing these two men for that date, it is planned.

If conflicting arrangements of schedules of these men prevent their being available, a tip-top pair of matmen will stage just about as good a show as they could put on, it is planned.

A Greek championship bout between Leo Papionas, who wrestled Dern here a short time ago, and later defeated Al Buford, Canadian mat champion in Las Vegas, and both of whom claim the Greek title, Kotsوناتas, also of Los Angeles, may take the place of the Dern-Yakiyama bout. This, if it proves to be the main event of the Friday wrestling card, will be as hot a match as could be scheduled, according to Promoter Mortenson, who is working with the Elks committee, Ernie Cragin and Art Harris.

Papionas threw Dern, the champion, once in a match with the titleholder a little less than a year ago in Salt Lake City, losing to the husky Utahian when Dern picked him up and gave him the famous "airplane spin," landing him on his ear.

This same hold was the means of Dern crushing Papionas in defeat when he wrestled him in Las Vegas. He got his first fall on a toe-hold, but the climax of the match was the sensational spin, for which Dern is famous.

Either of these two bouts would be the best fans could desire for entertainment. It is promised, and there are many other good men who want to have a Las Vegas match as an excuse to visit the Gateway City to Boulder Dam, according to Mortenson.
