### Party Visits Placer Mines

LOS ANGELES, July 1.—A party of mining engineers and operators left Los Angeles last week on a visit of inspection of the gold placer diggings of Boulder Dam Gold Placers, Inc., in the Lost Basin mining district on the Colorado river at the mouth of Grand Canyon, where an examination will be made of the company holdings. The party is headed by Mark Musgrove, president of the company, and Superintendent E. R. Dakson, formerly holding a similar position at the Bonney mine of the Pacific Copper company at Lordsburg, New Mexico.

A. H. Simpson, consulting engineer, is also a member of the party, while representatives of local machinery and equipment houses accompanied the visitors for the purpose of making bids on the construction and equipment of the proposed gold placer mining plant.

Among the visitors to the diggings at this time are Pat Maloney of Whittier and Louis Jacobs of Twenty-nine Palms. Musgrove announced before leaving that upon the installation of the pilot plant the company will be able to handle 55,000 cubic yards of gold bearing gravel daily. A Diesel engine and generator will also be installed to operate two motorized centrifugal pumps, which are to be used in connection with the operation of sluice boxes at the pilot plant.

### Woman Fights Husband For Birth Control

BRIDGEFIELD PARK, N. J., July 2. (UP)—Mrs. Emma Schilling will ask this week in county court for a "birth control injunction" to force her husband to respect her wishes to limit their family.

Mrs. Schilling is 27. She has had six children since her marriage seven years ago, the eldest being six years and the youngest eight weeks.

Her husband, a 41-year-old painter, is serving 30 days in jail because he threatened to kill her when she pleaded with him not to force her to have another child. Judge Alfred Fleishman, who sentenced him, will represent Mrs. Schilling when she asks County Judge Charles McCarthy for a birth control injunction.

"Some people don't believe in birth control," Mrs. Schilling said today. "Believe me, I do. It's a crime the way my husband treats me. I told him once 'Don't let us have any more children, at least for a while.' He said 'Shut your face, you've had six and you'll have six more!'"

### Gold Ace Mine Advances Drift

LOS ANGELES, July 1.—In commenting upon the operation of the Gold Ace Mining Company at Carrara, Nevada, General Manager G. Ray Boggs of Los Angeles, states the north drift from the bottom of the new double-compartment 80-foot shaft is now out a distance of 50 feet, following a six-foot body of ore assaying about \$14 to the ton in its gold content, exclusive of the occurrences of highgrade ore running from \$700 to \$800 to the ton in gold.

With a 60-foot further advance of the drift, Mr. Boggs says, it is expected contact will be made with the downward extension of the sensationally rich pipe or chimney of ore discovered on the surface a few weeks ago. From the bottom of the shaft a drift is also being run to the south, and all of the second-class ore broken on this level is trammed to the company's milling plant which is in regular commission with two shifts employes.

In driving north on the vein, Mr. Boggs reports, from 100 to 300 pounds of highgrade ore is being taken out daily and reduced to bullion by barrel amalgamation. The shaft is being continued to the 150-foot level from which depth drifts will be run north and south on the vein.

No. 2 cross-cut tunnel, it is stated, has exposed a five-foot body of \$45-ore which is being followed to the north; this ore, also broken, also being mill treated. The company is making consignments of gold bars weekly to the U. S. Mint. Forty men are employed at mine and mill and conditions are said to be most encouraging. Company stock is listed on the Los Angeles Curb Exchange.

### Pushing Work On Oro Amigo

LOS ANGELES, July 1.—Rex C. Ewing, mine manager for the Oro Amigo Platina Mining Company, writing from Goodsprings, Clark County, Nevada, states that trenching is being carried on in a systematic manner in exploration of the strong gold-bearing ledge on two adjoining claims recently added to company holdings, and that results are of such an encouraging nature as to justify the continuation of this surface development. The gold-bearing vein system, he says, enters the original domain included within the company boundary lines.

Work is still continuing, he reports, in developing the body of copper ore exposed in the winze below the second working level of the mine, where ore assaying up to 19 percent copper content is being mined and stored on the dump until such time as a carload shipment can be made. This body of ore, it is stated, gives evidence of permanency as work progresses in its development.

A ventilating plant has been sent out to the mine. When installed this will greatly facilitate mine operation and the opening up of the ore deposits at a greater depth. The mine is a neighbor of several noted producing mines in the Yellow Pine district. Company stock is listed on the Los Angeles Curb Exchange.

The building program being pushed in Las Vegas has been so constant during the past half year, since the passage of the Boulder Dam act, that at one time nine business buildings were under construction at one time. Besides numerous residences and smaller buildings.

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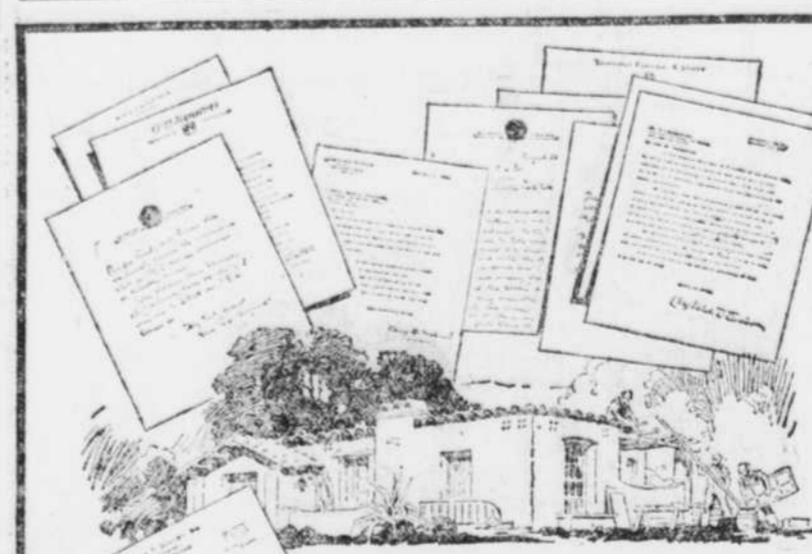

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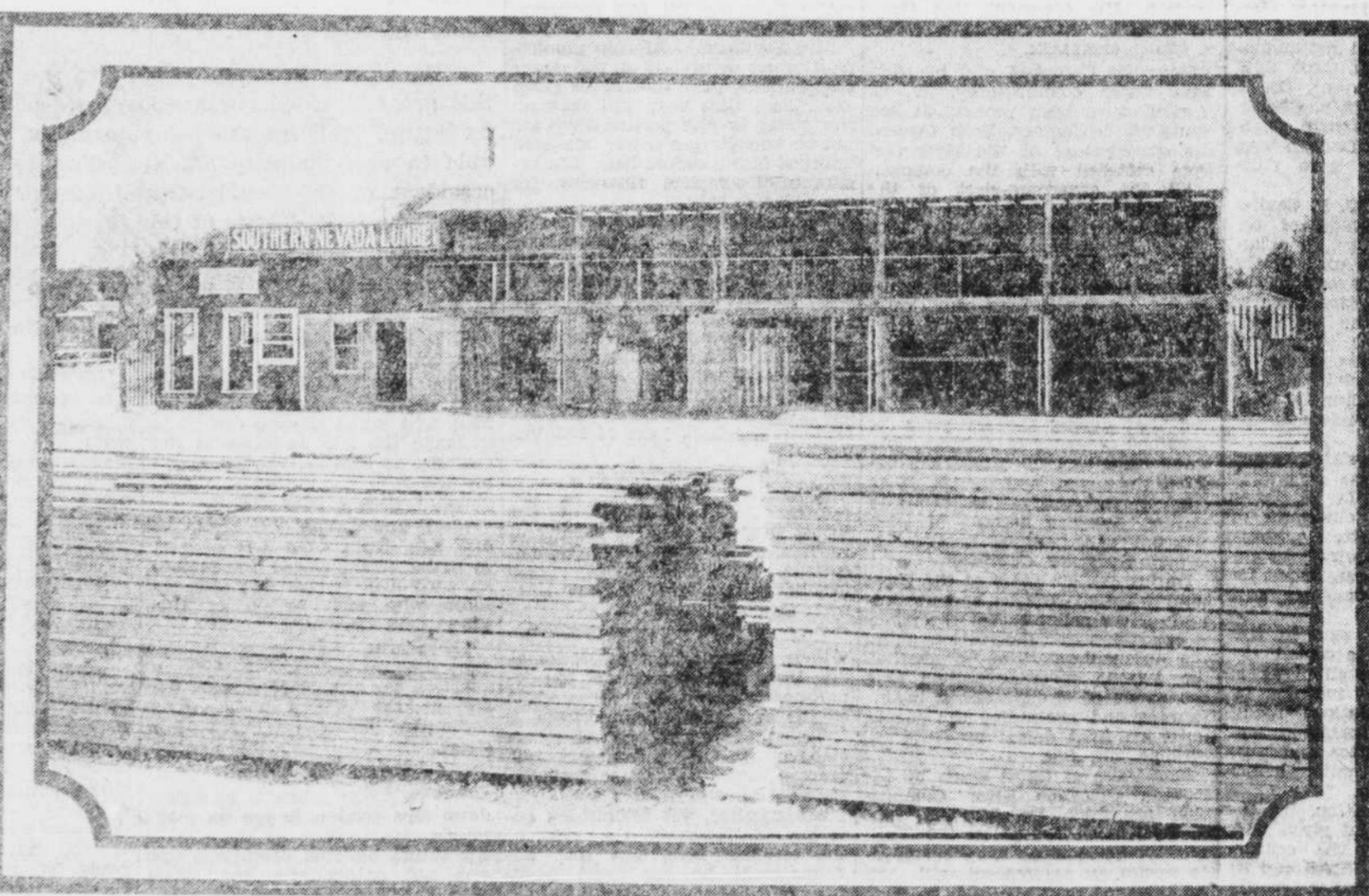
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
