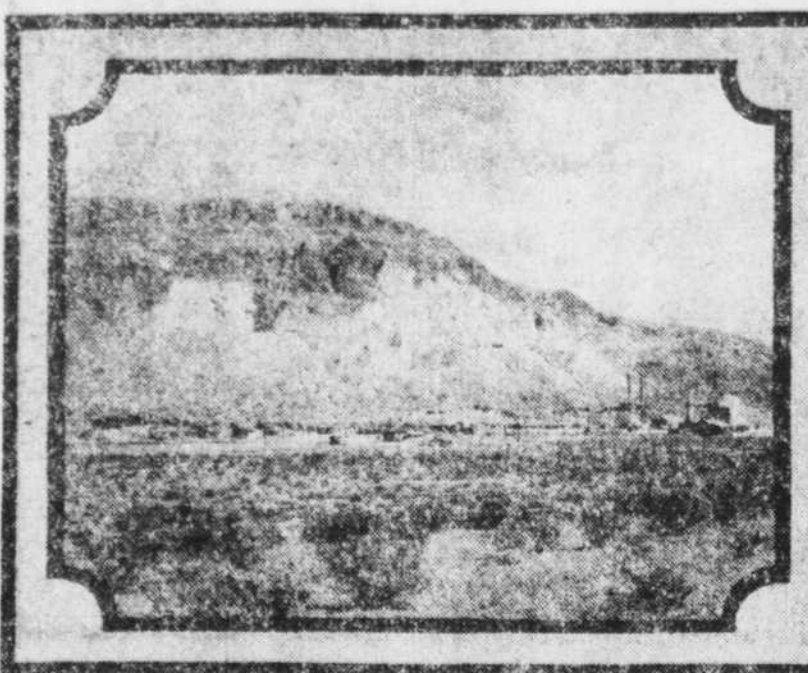

Some of Best Boys in California Are Slated To Perform Here During State Convention; Mickey Will Tangle With Experienced Boxer From Los Angeles; Action to Start at 7:30.

Some hot fighters will mix it for the entertainment of visiting Elks and native Las Vegans at 7:30 p.m. the Fourth of July.

Joe Salas, Billie DeFoe, Mickey Wallace, Mainard Goodman, Ross Sly, Eddie Brown, Kayo Farrell and Billy Boaz are the boys who will entertain on that notable evening in the new arena at the Union Pacific ball park.

Some of these sluggers have built up enviable reputations for themselves on the coast and every local fan knows what Mickey Wallace is good for, and how Ross Sly socks 'em. There will be twenty-eight rounds of grossing action for the boys and girls on this card, and it is promised there won't be a dull minute.

DeFoe, formerly of St. Paul, has been a Los Angeles battler now for some time, and sprung into prominence there by his cleverness and punch. The boy who will fight DeFoe ten rounds in the main event, Joe Salas, is one of George Blake's boys, from Los Angeles, and is a good friend of La Barba, former flyweight champion.

Mickey Wallace's wares are known all over Southern Nevada. He has pulled off a comeback which set fans all agog, and his careful training and consistent work make him always a spectacular performer.

Mickey will scrap Mainard Goodman of Los Angeles, an eight round go in which he expects to show the California lad something about boxing in the State of Nevada. Goodman, however, is no kid at the

game, and this match promises to be a real one.

Ross Sly has been a popular battler ever since he set foot into a Las Vegas ring. They like to see the way he takes punches and comes back unflinching to sock 'em just as hard as they gave. He's conceded to be a really clever battler. Eddie Brown, who will fight Ross for six rounds in the Elks' smoker, has been stunting around the Bay Cities for a couple of years, having recently moved his field of activity to Northern California.

Kayo Farrell will meet Billy Boaz, of San Francisco in a four-round curtain-lifter which promises to be a certain-lifter what is, Boaz has defeated Battling Bulahan and others of his class, and is going to make his debut in Vegas a lively one, it is predicted.

These bouts, which originally were slated to commence at 5 p. m., will start at 7:30 instead, so that the boys won't have such hot weather to contend with. It is anticipated by the promoters and managers that the fights themselves will be hot enough without any considerable assistance from Old Sol.
