Installation of the pump at the airport went ahead yesterday, following receipt by Simon of the equipment.

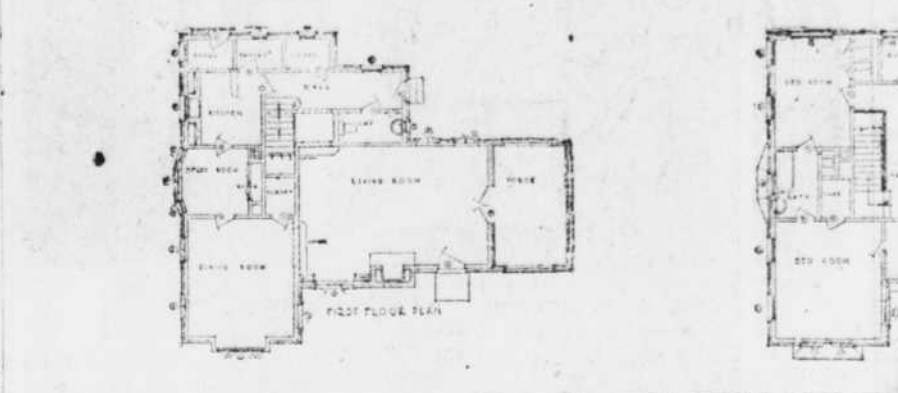
Grocers' Special to Go Through Vegas

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif., July 1.—(U.P.)—Four unidentified Mexicans were killed instantly today when their automobile ran off a switch-back on a road leading through the San Bernardino mountains.

The four apparently were traveling down grade at a high rate of speed when the wheels of their automobile locked and they were unable to make the turn. The machine and its occupants were hurled over a 200-foot cliff.

The car was demolished and the bodies of the four so badly crushed that immediate identification was impossible, police reported.
