Pair Are Saved by Parachute Jumps

JOHNSTOWN, Pa., July 1.—(U.P.)—A pilot and a passenger escaped death by leaping in parachutes when a large seven-passenger plane en route from New York to St. Louis crashed late today on a farm ten miles from here.

Richard Depew was the pilot. He is from Farmington, N. Y. A. A. Woodruff, Jr., leaped from the plane at 6,000 feet and the pilot dropped 4,000, landing about a mile apart.

The accident was said to have been caused when the pilot became lost in a heavy fog and the plane took a nose dive.

And The Perpetual Flying Game Goes On

CLEVELAND, Ohio, July 1.—(U.P.)—Having conquered the airman's worst enemy—fog—the endurance plane "City of Cleveland" tonight swept on in quest of a new record after a narrow escape from failure today.

Twice the re-fueling ship established contact with the big monoplane, but not until early afternoon was the first successful contact made, after a lapse of 17 hours. The plane had been in the air more than 75 hours tonight.

'Dead' Flyer Walks In, Surprises Parents

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., July 1.—(U.P.)—While his parents were sadly drawing up plans for his funeral, C. C. Garrett, Jr., 22, aviator, who had been missing since last Wednesday, walked into his home here.

The parents had given up hopes of their son being found alive after they had heard no word of him since last Wednesday, when he left Wichita, Kansas, in an airplane with Mathew Hoff, of Hollywood, Calif., for Pittsburgh, Pa.
