Use of Airmail Continues to Grow

Growth of the use of the airmail by Las Vegas is shown by the comparative figures for the last three months released yesterday by Postmaster Robert B. Griffith. During June 317 pounds and 7 ounces of airmail went out from Las Vegas, as compared with 311 pounds 2 ounces in May and 180 pounds 5 ounces in April. Airmail stamps sold during the past four months are as follows: March—2,200. April—2,400. May—3,300. June—3,600. The postoffice now closes its outgoing dispatches at 9:30 p.m., instead of 8:30, according to the postmaster.
