ORDINANCE NO. 133. An Ordinance regulating the collection and fixing and establishing rates and compensation to be collected by any person, company or corporation collecting garbage in the City of Las Vegas, and repealing Ordinance No. 89 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas Regulating the Storage and Removal of Garbage, Offal, and Refuse, Animal and Vegetable Matter..."

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do Ordain as follows: Section 1. That in order to promote the public welfare of the said City of Las Vegas, it is hereby ordained and directed that the following portion of Lewis Street in Wardie Addition to the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, in said City of Las Vegas, to-wit: That portion of said Lewis Street lying between the North property line of Block number 18 and the south property line of Block number eight (8) in said Wardie Addition, for the entire width of said two blocks, be and the same is hereby vacated for use by Clark County Educational District No. 2 in the County of Clark, State of Nevada, the owner and occupant of said two blocks abutting upon said portion of Lewis Street, for high school purposes. Provided, however, that said portion of Lewis Street shall be closed a nd kept closed after the passage of this Ordinance solely by and at the expense of the said Clark County Educational District No. 2.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication for a period of one week (three issues) in The Las Vegas Age, a tri-weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas. I hereby certify that the foregoing Ordinance was read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, held on the 19th day of June, 1929, and read for the second time and passed at a recessed regular meeting of said Board of Commissioners held on the 5th day of July, 1929, upon the following vote: Commissioners O. ORDINANCE NO. 141. An Ordinance regulating the parking of vehicles in certain portions of the City of Las Vegas, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof, and other matters relating thereto.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do Ordain as follows: Section 1. Whenever in this Ordinance the following terms are used, they shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section: "PARK"—To stand a vehicle for a period of time greater than is reasonably necessary for the actual loading or unloading of persons or materials.

"BUSINESS DISTRICT"—The territory contiguous to a street when fifty per cent (50%) or more of the lots thereon for a distance of three hundred (300) feet or more is occupied by buildings in use for retail or wholesale business; also any territory contiguous to a street which is immediately adjacent to a continuation of a street within a business district when such territory is so designated by the Chief of Police.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to park the same upon any street for the purpose of displaying it for sale, or to park any vehicle upon any street in any business district from which said vehicle merchandise is being sold.

Section 3. No vehicle shall be left standing over night in any of the alleys of a business district in said City of Las Vegas.

Section 4. No vehicle shall at any time be parked in any of the alleys of said city in such a manner as to obstruct traffic therein, and no vehicle shall at any time be parked in a new city parking ordinance providing for parking in the middle of the newly paved streets probably will be passed at the meeting of the city board to start at 3 p. m. today, according to Mayor J. F. Hesse.

The proposed ordinance, which would bring about the parking down the sides of the streets, near the curb, was brought up at the last meeting of the commissioners and disagreement as to whether the parking should be parallel to the curb or at an angle kept the commissioners from passing the measure.

Section 5. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5) nor more than one hundred (\$100) dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than two days nor more than fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication for a period of one week (three issues) in The Las Vegas Age, a tri-weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas.
