Work Is Started On Yellow Pine Flotation Plant

Ore That Runs \$300 to the Ton Found Fifty Feet Deep by Ray Morris; Samples Attract Wide Attention.

Construction of a new \$60,000 flotation plant was started at Good Springs Monday. It was learned here yesterday, and is expected to be in operation in about ninety days.

The Yellow Pine company is building the plant, which will be for separation of lead. A crew of men is now working on the preliminaries of the construction work.

Board Adopts Specifications For Lighting

The Board of City Commissioners at its meeting Tuesday evening finally adopted specifications for the proposed ornamental street lighting system.

Traffic Count Shows Increase In Auto Travel

Two Days Count Shows Nearly Eight Hundred Cars Per Day Over Arrowhead Highway.

A tremendous increase in motor traffic over the Arrowhead Highway is shown by the two days count ending at 6:00 a.m. Wednesday morning.

The count is carried on over the 24 hours each day and will continue through the week. It is the annual count made by the State Highway Department.

For the 24 hours beginning at 6:00 a.m. Monday morning and ending at 6:00 a.m. Tuesday morning, 787 cars passed over the highway at a point three miles south of Fremont street. This is well outside the city and does not include travel to the airfield and the ranches south of town reached by the old highway passing the airfield.

For the 24 hours beginning at 6:00 a.m. Tuesday morning 797 cars were shown by the count.

Of these 369 or nearly 50 per cent are cars from other states than Nevada. The cars average 3.6 persons each.

The heaviest traffic was found to be from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., when approximately 40 per cent of the cars passed.

The average for the week's count last year was 584 cars per day, of which 236 were from other states. The increase in total traffic this year over last year, if the figures of Monday and Tuesday keep up through the week will approximate 35 per cent.

The foreign cars are carrying Miss Matide Frazier surprised Clark county each day. Since they must have oil, gas and tire repairs, food and small replacements in apparel, and those who remain over night lodgings as well, it is seen that the Arrowhead Highway is an important asset in the business of Clark county.

Incidentally it may be said that the travel over the Arrowhead Highway is more than twice that of both the highways across the northern part of the state.
