Commissioners to Vote on Uniform Measure, Drawn Up by Frank Stevens, Month from Yesterday.

Las Vegas will have a new building code if an ordinance read for the first time to the city commissioners yesterday afternoon is passed at its second reading a month from yesterday.

was drawn up by Frank Stevens, city attorney, provides for the adoption of the "Uniform Building Code, 1927 Edition," published January, 1928, by the Pacific Coast Building Officials' Conference. Three copies of this code are now on file in the city clerk's office, according to the ordinance.

stricken at the sudden turn events had taken. From Shanghai it was reported to the Daily Mail that General Chiang Kai-Shek, nominal head of the Chinese nationalist government, had summoned important political leaders for a special conference at Nanking today.

At Nanking the situation was considered grave, but it was not believed it would lead to open warfare between the two republics. It was felt there the Russian note to China breaking off diplomatic relations indicated a determination to defend Soviet rights in Manchuria rather than a desire to embark on warfare.

Political opinion here was divided as to whether there was any justification on the part of Russia in breaking off diplomatic relations with the far eastern republic. All were unanimous, however, in the belief that there was no immediate likelihood of war.
