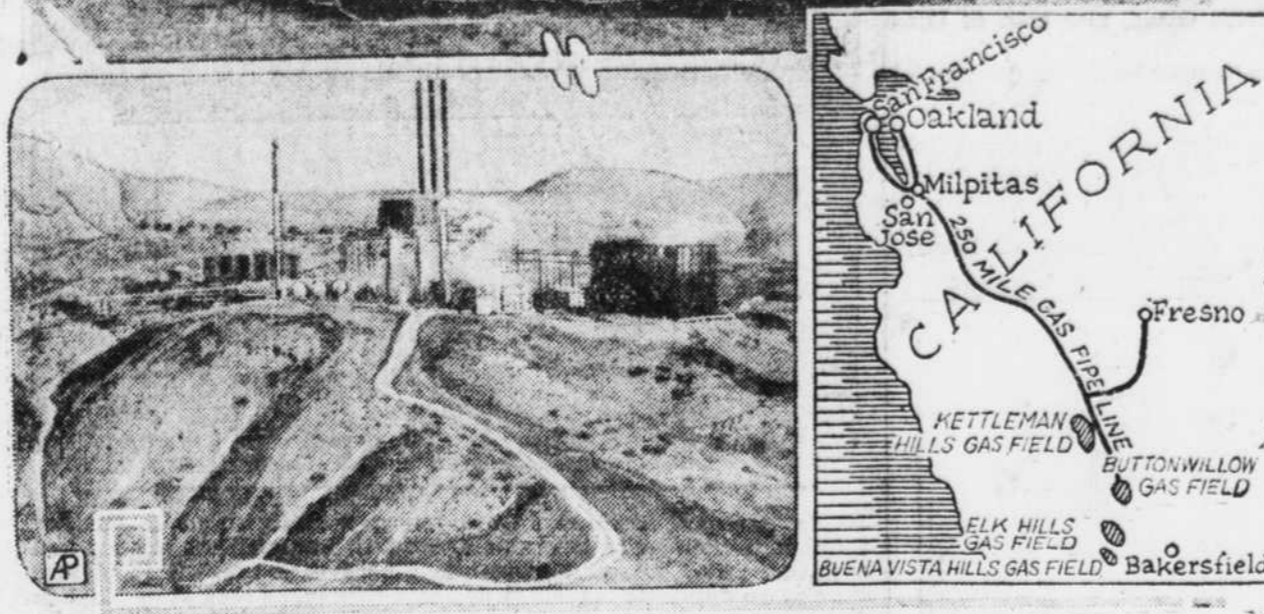
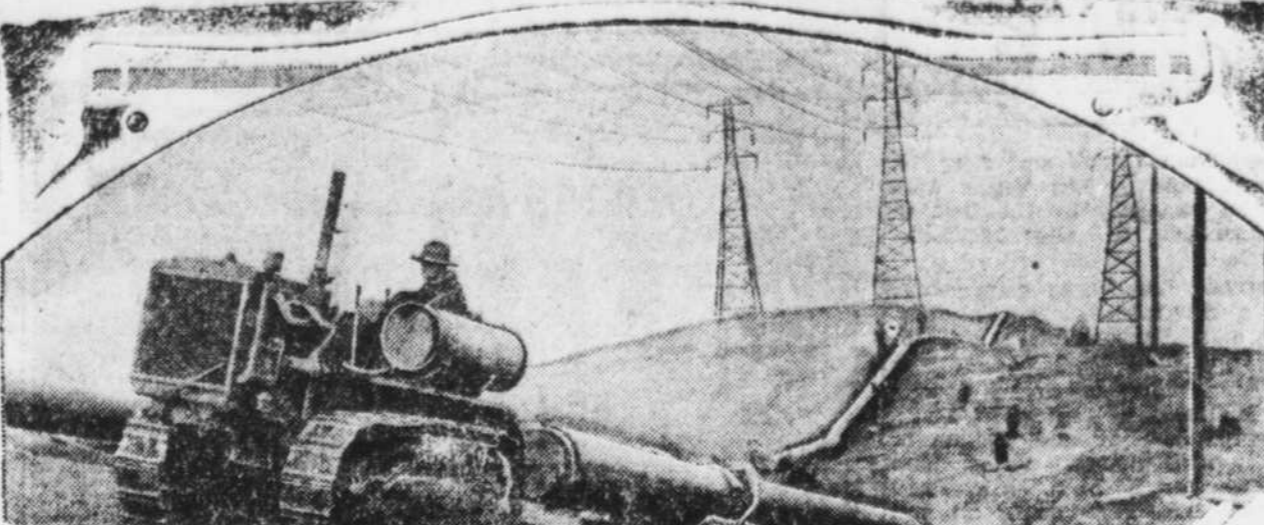


Musical Comedy With Varnadore, Beauty Chorus at El Patio Tonight

Clark County Farm Club Members To Attend Annual Camp At Reno

Moapa Valley Representatives Made Such Fine Records at Previous Gatherings They Will Have Hard Time Keeping Up Standard: Young Folk to Study Farm, Home Techniques. Clark County representatives have made such enviable records on former years at the annual Junior Farm Bureau Club held during the summer in Reno that they are going to have a hard time this year improving on previous laurels, according to Mary Stillwell Buol, assistant director of agricultural extension for the University of Nevada, who was in Las Vegas recently.

San Francisco, July 22, (U.P.)—Wastage of natural resources described as one of the most appalling ever charged against the oil industry is a spectacle of the new Kettleman field in south central California.

A single well is blowing off 500,000,000 cubic feet of dry gas weekly and more than 25 additional wells are being rushed to completion. One of this escaping gas 47,000 gallons of gasoline is being extracted daily, but this salvage, state conservation officials point out, loses much of its economic significance, in the light of the asserted over-production of oil. Federal state and oil officials are groping about for an understanding or common basis upon which a united movement can be founded to conserve the natural treasure of this great field, but the most immediate hope is believed by its proponents to be a new California law.

Codling Moth Meets Its Fate

BOISE, Idaho, July 22, (U.P.)—War to the death between an unknown small white parasite and the destructive codling moth is seen as a possibility by the state department of agriculture. The department reports the discovery of a large number of dead codling moths in orchards in the vicinity of Adams county. Their death apparently was caused by a small white parasite. The probability of development of the parasite to combat the moth has been suggested.

Stills Cause Forest Fires

BUTTE, Mont., July 22, (U.P.)—Careless campers and smokers are not alone to blame for forest fires. Another menace to the giants of the wilderness has appeared. A 75-eallon still 10 miles east of Warm Springs exploded, threatening destruction of several hundred acres of virgin timber. One of two other stills was blown 100 feet by the explosion, and a house was burned to the ground. Nearby rangers and ranchers managed to extinguish the fire before it did more damage to the forest.

Oddie Would Ban Closing Austin Office

RENO, Nev., July 22, (U.P.)—Senator Oddie has filed a protest at Washington against the closing of the forest service office at Austin, Nev. The proposal of the Department of Agriculture is to consolidate the Austin office with the office at Ely. Senator Oddie, in his protest, declared this would inconvenience the stockmen of central Nevada who run their stock on the reserves of the Austin region. He declared that the move had been taken by Washington officials unaccompanied with conditions in Nevada.
