Traffic Will Move Next To Curbs To Compact New Paving If Proposed Measure Is Passed.

> For a period of 60 days afetr the passage of the ordinance cars will be left standing parallel to the curbs, and with left hind wheels not more than two feet from the center of the street. This is for the purpose of getting the edges of the pavement packed

been packed, it is explained. The oil-bound gravel needs a certain amount of rolling, and this must come from regular traffic, after the steam roller goes over the paving. Cars will be allowed to park next to the curbs only long enough for unloading of passengers or freight. Penalties for violation of the ordinance will be \$2.50 to \$100 fine and one and one-fourth to fifty days,
