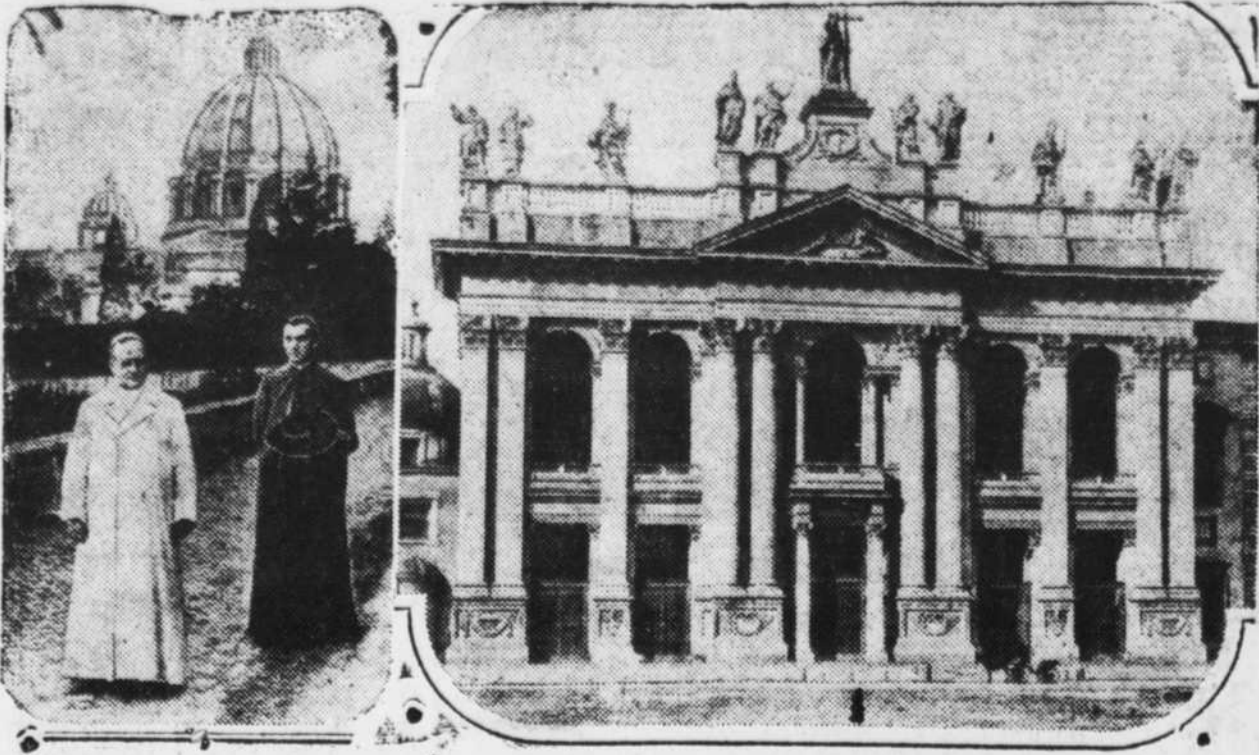

SAN FRANCISCO, July 25, (U.P.)—The liner Venezuela, ashore seven miles off the harbor of Cartagena, Colombia, is in no danger, Captain Peter Hansen reported to officials of the Panama Mail line by cable today.

The vessel left this port July 4 bound for New York with a passenger list of 110 and a crew of more than 100 men.

Captain Hansen's cable said that the Venezuela grounded on a sand bar shortly after 9 a.m. He expressed the belief the vessel would be refloated.

NEW YORK, July 26, (U.P.)—The Panama Mail liner Venezuela, which went aground yesterday on Samedina Banks, 20 miles from Cartagena, Colombia, reached Cartagena last night, according to word received at the line's offices here today.
