Do Away With Incinerators, Says Engler

Burners Not Only Unnecessary Under New Garbage Collection System, But A Fire Hazard, Concern Head States.

That incinerators are not now at all necessary in Las Vegas was pointed out yesterday by Ernest J. Engler, head of the interests in charge of the removal of all garbage from the city.

"We cart away all garbage, now," said Engler, "and it is not only unnecessary for home-owners or business folk to maintain these burners in their back yards, but it is a thing which should be minimized speedily, and eventually done away with.

"The back-yard incinerator smokes up the city, and makes a disagreeable odor oftentimes, in addition to the fire hazard, which really is one of the biggest reasons why they should be done away with.

"If investigations were made of fire insurance rates here and in other cities where incinerators are not allowed, I venture to say there would be a revelation."

In the larger cities incinerators are expressly forbidden. Engler stated, the collection method being more satisfactory all around.

"We do not have the contract to clean the streets," Engler explained. "But we do promise faithfully to remove all garbage, as defined in the new city ordinance, when it is placed out where it is available. And any failure on our part to do this we want reported to us.

"We hope eventually to bring everyone to the realization that they may as well stop using their incinerators."

City Accepts Street Paving

The Board of City Commissioners at Thursday's meeting, passed a resolution accepting the paving work, the contractor having made an attempt to remedy the defects pointed out by the report of Street Superintendent J. P. King in his report to the board.

The resolution reads as follows:

WHEREAS, A. P. Slocum, engineer for the city of Las Vegas, has heretofore made final inspection and approval of the work done by Roche-Axman Company for street improvements in the City of Las Vegas under contract with the City of Las Vegas bearing date the 13th day of March, 1929, and said engineer has made and filed in writing a final estimate of the amount of work done thereunder, and his report and approval of said work; and

WHEREAS, from the said report and from an independent investigation made on behalf of the Board of City Commissioners by the Street Superintendent, this Board is satisfied as to the amount of work performed, as to the acceptable fulfillment of said contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved, that the said work under said contract be and the same is hereby accepted and the final payment in accordance with said final estimate be made 35 days from the passage and adoption of this resolution.

Commissioners Thomas, Smith and His Honor Mayor Hesse voted aye. Noes, none. Commissioner Hansell was not present at the meeting, and Commissioner German, who was present during the early part of the session had left the room.

Comment on the resolution is futile. The engineer in drawing up the specifications and form for the contract, provided that he himself should be the judge of whether the work was according to specifications or not.

So far as the Age can see the board now has no alternative but to get the contractor to correct defects so far as possible and pay for the job. Because Mr. Slocum says it is "all right," and under the specifications, his word is law.

Lay-More Tile Plant Is Busy

The Desert Construction Company, which has its office at 115 North Fifth street, is keeping a force of men busy at its Lay-More Tile plant, located on Twelfth street, between Stewart and Ogden.

The Editor of the Age visited the plant yesterday and was surprised to see the great number of the cement building tile already on hand and ready for putting in the wall.

The Lay-More Tile is a novel interlocking tile which is laid with the minimum of cement mortar and at a rapid rate because of the simplicity of construction. The material seems to be well adapted to buildings in this climate, being cool in summer and warm in winter.

The plant is working three machines to capacity and expects to have tile ready for several fine blocks this fall.

Center Parking Ruling Passed

Beginning Saturday morning, Aug. 10, all automobiles parking on streets recently paved must park in the middle of the street instead of near the curb, according to an ordinance passed Thursday afternoon by the city commissioners.

This will continue for 60 days, and is for the purpose of packing the new paving along the less traveled edges of the streets. A certain amount of use is necessary to roll the new oil-sand gravel into a compact, smooth surface. The centers of the streets have become comparatively smooth, it is pointed out, while the edges are still rough and largely unpacked.

Cars must park parallel to the middle of the street, on the side of the street on which they had been traveling, and so that the left-hand wheels are not more than two feet from the center line of the street. Sufficient room must be left for other vehicles already parked to depart conveniently.

Penalties are provided for violation of this ordinance, which is published in full on the legal page of this issue of the Age.
