

Soviet Rejects **China Request** For Conference

Russia Demands Establishing of 'Status Quo Ante' In Manchuria In Connection with Eastern Railway.

By EUGENE LYONS United Press Staff Correspondent MOSCOW, Aug. 5.-(U.P.)-Soviet MOSCOW, Aug. Russia has rejected China's proposal for a conference to settle the current Chinese Eastern railway dispute and has demanded the Mukden government establish the "status quo ante" in Manchuria in connection with the road.

It was announced here Leo Karakhan, assistant commissar for foreign affairs, in charge of eastern affairs, has rejected flatly the written proposal from Chang Hsuen-Liang of Manchuria, that the dispute be settled by an immediate conference between the two nations.

Karakhan demanded firstly that Mukden agree to the appointment of a Soviet manager for the eastern Chinese Railway and secondly, that she accept a formula indicating that the seizure of the road by Chinese authorities recently violated the treaties between Russia and China. In connection with the rejection of Chang's proposal oreign office published the details of the negotiations leading up to the rejection. They said that on July 22 Foreign Minister Tsi of the Mukden government made a series of proposals to Moscow on behalf of Chang. The foreign office states that it sub-

On August 1, the foreign office communique said, Chang made his direct proposals, first, calling a conference, second, that the disputed railway be regulated after the conference on a basis of the treaties, and, third that the arrested Chinese and Soviet nationals be freed. The question of appointing a Soviet manager for the railway, the communique said, was ignored by
