

LEGAL NOTICES

ORDINANCE NO. 144

An ordinance providing the manner of parking vehicles in certain areas of the City of Las Vegas for a period of sixty days from and after the passage, approval and completed publication of this ordinance, providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance, and other matters relating thereto.

Section 1. Whenever in this ordinance the following terms are used they shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section: PARK—To stand a vehicle for a period of time greater than is reasonably necessary for the actual loading or unloading of persons or materials.

Section 2. For a period of sixty days from and after the passage, approval and completed publication of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to park the same or cause the same to be parked in or upon any street in the following areas in said City of Las Vegas, unless such vehicle shall be parked parallel to the middle of the street on the side of the street on which it was traveling at the time of parking and so that the left hand wheels of such vehicle shall stand no more than two feet from the center line of the street.




