FOR DAM SITE

It is to house these men and their families, approximately 4,000 persons, that Dr. Elwood Mead, commisioner of reclamation, has approved the site for a town that may beein to form within the next year. Twenty-eight miles from Las Vagas. Nev., the site nestles in a canyon that opens out fan like into a gravel-strewn valley. It looks down on a panorama of the Colorado

river. Upstream, huge black cliffs rise perpendicularly from the water and bare rock mountains stretch away for 100 miles in the back-

Between the town and the dam is a mass of broken hills around which the river describes a twomile arc. Even the proposed rail-road for which the Union Pacific now has application pending, does not try to cross them. Coming up from the south, it stops at the ridge and sends a spur on each side of the river, cutting through the proposed town site and the other leading direct to the dam.

The plans place the town on both a railway and a highway, on a uni-form slope that falls 800 feet in the two miles to the river. From the edge of the canyon it is a sheer drop of 1,000 feet to the bottom. Their little community will have

stores, churches and schools. Their homes may be built either by the The government or contractors. vernment will retain ownership of the land and lease it to those who live on it or use it for commercial purposes.

Although the neat is intense in June, July and August, the winters are delightful. 
