Streams May Be

Some of Southern Nevada's streams may be stocked with fish if plans now afoot materialize, accoring to J. H. Wittwer, local extension agent and farm bureau representative.

A survey of Lincoln county streams recently made at the request of the Lincoln county farm bureau by J. H. Ford, of Richfield, cluding testimonials of healing through Christian Science, 7:39 Utah, has led to the conclusion, on p.m. the part of Ford, that some of them are wel adapted to trout and

The matter will be taken up with county commissioners, the deputy game warden and fish warden and others, and the idea of establishing rearing ponds and stocking the streams discused. The Panaca and Pahranagat val-

leys were found especially suitable for bass, while Spring Valley is said to be suitable for trout. Eagle valley also was reported on favorably by Ford who has a private fish hatchery at Richfield.

These streams, it was pointed out by Creel, if stocked with game fish, would be easily accessible to fishermen from Clark, Nye and White Pine Counties.



21 hours and 44 minutes, several hours better than the Mauretania's best previous time. The ship reach


