Splendid Specially-Constructed Sidewalk Sets off Carl Ray's Professional Building as 'Most Metropolitan'

The most metropolitan stretch of sidewalk in the city! That's the boast of Carl Ray, upon completion of his new Professional building on Fremont, with its hundred foot expanse of fine sixteen foot pavement stretching the length of the Professional building and the Age building next door.

The sidewalk sets off the beautiful structure and gives it a distinctive appearance the superior of which is not found even in Hollywood, it has been agreed. The sidewalk will be colored, after it has been given several weeks to become thoroughly dried, and will then give the appearance of a beautiful tile, the squares having a variety of harmonious colors.

Mr. Ray arrived here yesterday from Los Angeles, where he had made a brief business trip. He expects to see his workmen put the "finishing touches" on the building by tonight. The rubber tile man has completed the stairways, and George Seamer, decorator will leave for Los Angeles tonight.

Miss M. Spangler, who has been for ten years Ray's private secretary in Hollywood, has taken up residence with her mother, Mrs. Snyder, in the one and only apartment suite in the building. Mrs. Snyder will have charge of the building.

Complete and detailed regular reports of all city officials and employees who take in money for the City of Las Vegas will be a feature of the new accounting and auditing system being installed by W.
