The agriculture leader is Ray Fife state superintendent of agricultural education of Ohio. Miss Dorothy Ellis, state supervisor of home economics of Idaho,

will preside over the economic section, while G. S. Sanders, state supervisor of trade and industrial education of Arizona will head the industrial group.
