Balzar to Open

State Livestock Show Thursday

Elko County Fair Will Be Combined With Nevada Show Opening September 12; Thrills Promised.

ELKO, Sept. 9.—The Nevada State Livestock Show and Elko County Fair will be opened in this city on September 12 by Governor Fred Balzar. He will lead a short program after which the first race of the fair will be run. Fred Danberg, president of the Nevada Livestock association, is also scheduled to make a short address of welcome to the livestockmen of the west, many of whom will be present because of the excellent type of exhibits promised for the fair. A premium list of \$12,000, an exhibit of livestock from California, Oregon, Utah, Idaho and Nevada, six races daily of hot blooded government colts of Northern Nevada, with pari-mutuel betting; two baseball games, dances, airplane rides and talkie movies are some of the attractions which will no doubt help to make this show successful.

One of the thrillers of the show will be Trixie, famous high school horse owned by A. G. Shriver of Truckee. This famous horse is the only one in the west that will jump an automobile without being ridden. Word has been received from the Aerial archery of Salt Lake City that it will be here for the show. This band carries ten pieces, all the members being specialists. They will entertain at the afternoon show and will play for dances in the evenings. A \$800 purse is being offered for the Elko county derby this year. This is the biggest purse ever paid for a race in this city, run as part of the show.

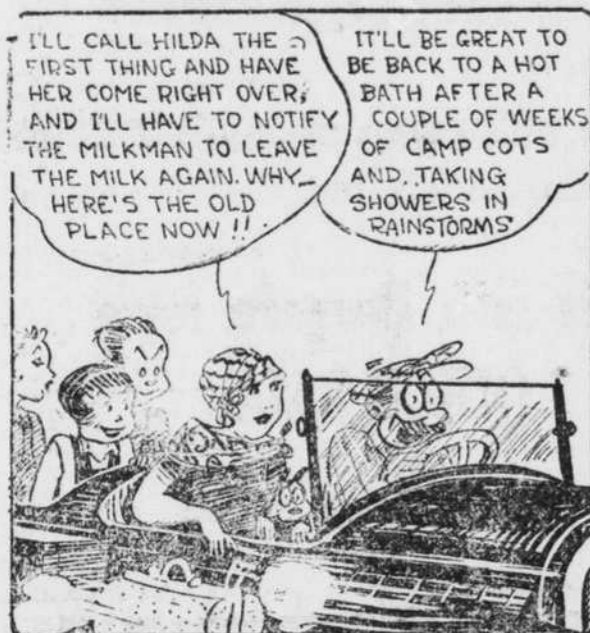

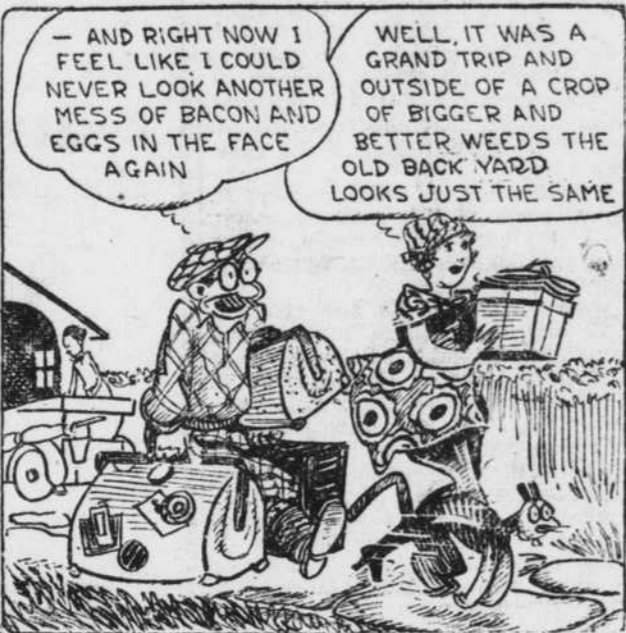

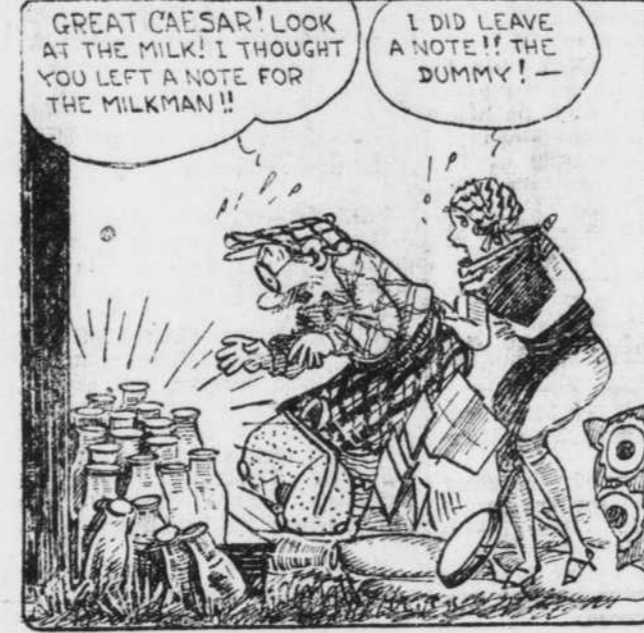
