New U. P. Engine Tanks Installed

Installation of 15,000 gallon water tanks to supplant the 15,000 gallon ones formerly in use on all 8900 class freight engines on this division is about half finished. The new tanks are 18 inches higher than the old ones, which necessitates raising of many of the water and oil columns. The work will be completed in two weeks or so, it is expected. The change is prompted by greater operation economy. Occasionally an engine runs out of water during a particularly hard pull in a storm, and has to cut loose from its string of cars and run on to the next column for water, thus losing much valuable time. The larger tanks will make this emergency less likely to occur.
