Pilot House of San Juan Found

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 14. (U.P.)—The pilot house of the S. S. San Juan, with many persons aboard on Aug. 29, was sighted by the San Juan's sister ship, the S. S. Humboldt, on Sept. 11, it was learned here today.

The Humboldt, en route from San Francisco to Los Angeles, discovered the pilot house approximately 120 miles south of Pigeon Point where the San Juan went down after a collision with the oil tanker Dodd.
Captain Baughman of the Humboldt identified the wreckage. He made an attempt to get it aboard and, failing, sent men over the sides to investigate it.
No bodies were found and after an attempt was made to destroy the wreckage, the Humboldt proceeded here.

C. C. Johns, managing editor of the Corona Daily Independent, reported the incident of sighting the pilot house.

Wave Upsets U. S. Boat In Race; Two Are Injured

VENICE, Sept. 14. (U.P.)—The first of the international speed boat races—the Tropic cup race—was annulled today after the American entrant, Miss America VII, sustained an accident which resulted in injury to her crew of two.

Phil Wood, the pilot and brother of Gar Wood, owner of the trim craft which holds the speed record, and Orin Johnson, the mechanic, were injured, but are improving.
The event was won by Sir Harry Seagrave, the British racer, today, who made approximately 88 kilometers, 560 meters an hour, almost 55 miles an hour. He agreed to run the test tomorrow.
The Miss America VII started at a speed far superior to the British entry. She was speeding at a high rate when the craft struck a tall breaker, which tossed the boat 14 feet into the air.
