NOTICE OF CREATION OF BRAND INSPECTION DISTRICT

Notice is hereby given that the State Board of Stock Commissioners, in accord with Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929, approved March 26, 1929, has declared all of Clark County and part of Lincoln County, State of Nevada, a brand inspection district, effective September 23, 1929, to be administered in accord with the regulations set forth below:

Regulation 1. BOUNDARIES OF BRAND INSPECTION DISTRICT

The brand inspection district hereby created shall include all of Clark County and all of that part of Lincoln County, State of Nevada, lying south of a line running due east and west through the station of Leith on the Union Pacific Railroad.

Regulation 2. REMOVAL OF NEAT CATTLE, HORSES AND MULES FROM THE BRAND INSPECTION DISTRICT

On and after September 23, 1929, it shall be unlawful to ship, transport, drive, or otherwise remove any neat cattle, horses or mules from the brand inspection district hereby created except in accord with the provisions of Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929.

Regulation 3. REQUESTS FOR AND MAKING OF INSPECTIONS

Inspectors of the State Board of Stock Commissioners shall make inspections at the time and place requested and without unnecessary delay upon the receipt of a notification from a common carrier in

accord with the provisions of Section 4, Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929; or a request from any person other than a common carrier in accord with the provisions of Section 5, Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929; unless engaged in making similar inspections elsewhere pursuant to such notices or requests previously received: Provided, that all inspections shall be made in daylight; provided further, that any neat cattle, horses or mules offered for inspection must be assembled and held for that purpose in accord with the provisions of section 6, Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929.

Regulation 4. INSPECTION FEES AND COLLECTION OF SAME.

The fees for brand inspection in the district hereby created are hereby set in accord with the provisions of Section 8, Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929, at twenty-five cents (25c) per head with a minimum charge of seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) for each inspection made; provided, that any inspection at one time and place within any one day shall be considered as a single inspection for the levy and collection of inspection fees even though the neat cattle, horses or mules inspected are presented for that purpose by two or more parties who shall agree among themselves to that arrangement and pay the fees levied jointly; provided further, that the neat cattle, horses or mules so offered for a joint inspection are to be shipped, driven, transported, or otherwise moved to a single consignee and destination. All inspection fees shall be collected by the inspector making the inspection before any brand inspection clearance certificate is issued.

Regulation 5. MATTERS AND PROCEDURES NOT PROVIDED FOR IN ABOVE REGULATIONS.

All matters and procedures relative to the administration of the brand inspection district hereby created not specifically covered and

provided for in the above regulations shall be conducted strictly in accord with the provisions of Chapter 145, Statutes of Nevada, 1929. State Board of Stock Commissioners

Boy, 13, Falls and Fractures Bones For 36th Time

BELLAIRE, O.—(U.P.)—Billy Neuhart was late in answering the school bell this fall. And Billy, who at the age of 13 has suffered a total of 36 fractured bones, had planned to be present the very first day. The day before school opened, Billy's legs gave out under him, causing him to fall and fracture both limbs. Just a month previous he fell and fractured four ribs. "Gee, I won't get to go to school now," Billy cried when he learned his legs were broken.

Since he was 14 months old Bill has been the victim of accidents. This is the second time he has fractured both legs. The first time he was bedfast for several months. It was during this siege the lad received more than 50,000 letters, cards, telegrams and packages from all parts of the United States and several foreign countries.
