Rio Congress Aids Pan American Road Says Senator Oddie

Foundations For Inter-American Highway Securely Laid, According to American Delegate.

WASHINGTON D. C. Sept. 18-Accomplishing more than any other meeting of its kind, the Second Pan American Congress of Highways, held at Rio de Janerio during the last two weeks of August, may be locked upon as the greatest single factor to date in the eventual establishment of an inter-American highway extending from North America to all countries in Central and South America, according to Senator Tasker L. Oddie of Nevada, member of the United States delegation, who has just returned to Washington from Brazil. Senator Oddie was one of

"Of outstanding importance and tions to all their highway problems operated splendidly.

'The realization that economic development will be materially advanced by opening their countries to automotive transportation has perhaps contributed more than any other factor to the unanimous desire of having a network of modern roads connecting the principal cities of the countries of the Western Hemisphere. As a result the work of the Pan American Congress will do more for the good roads movement in the countries to the south of us than anything

Of significance, Senator Oddie traced directly to the road Congress, the Senator pointed out, its coming within so short a time Sheriff, after the Argentinean delegates had returned to their country, is

"The real foundation of the inter-American highway was laid at this Congress," Senator Oddie continued. "Following the parleys, all delegates realized the importance which an inter-American highway will assume, not only from the standpoint of national economy

but also from that of promoting friendly understanding among the various nationalities. "President Hoover's trip to South America was of great importance in increasing the friendly rela-

tions that have existed between Latin American countries and the United States. His magnificent reception in Brazil is still talked of and his interest in the economic welfare of Latin America is well His trip did much to known. smooth out any misunderstandings that may have existed between the United States and other countries. and, incidentally, to hasten construction of the inter-American highway Senator Tasker L. Oddie, accom-

panied by Mrs. Oddie, has been in Rio de Janeiro, representing the United State at the Pan American Road Conference, according to word received this week by the Age.

The work of the conference was very successful, Brazil and other South American nations needing highways and desiring the co-operation of the United States in promoting routes of travel.
