and the other six—were arraigned
yesterday on charges of manslaugh-
ter.

cristo, 6, were brought into court on
complaint of Mrs. Vira Lopresta,
that while playing they kicked her
son, Frank, 5, in the abdomen, caus-
ing his death.
The two little boys were accom-
panied by their father and clung to
him, whimpering occasionally. They
were paroled to the father, pending
grand jury action.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20. (AP)—
Senator Heflin, Democrat, Ala.,
issued a statement today demand-
ing the resignation of John J. Raskob,
as chairman of the Democratic Na-
tional committee, declaring "Party
machinery is being used as a private
agency to promote the candidacy of
Governor Smith for President in
1932."
