The game is scheduled to start at 2:30 p. m. Sunday.

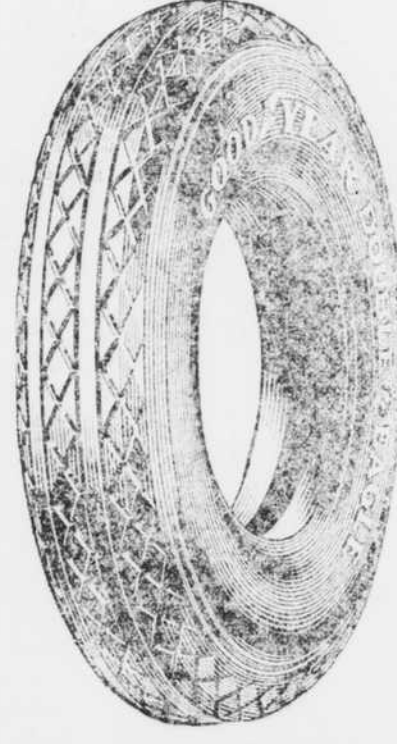
SHIPPING PIONEER IS MEMBER OF FRATERNITY

NEW YORK — Something like 71 years ago a family of Falkirk Scots arrived in Quebec, a youngster of 14 years of age in tow. Dollar was the name of the family, Robert that of the lad, states the New York Masonic Outlook. Twenty years later found Robert over in Bracebridge, Ontario, where with a group of comrades he became a charter member of a new Masonic Lodge, Muskoka, No. 360. Today, at the age of 85 years, Robert Dollar is the greatest single figure in the entire mercantile marine world. He is president of the Dollar Steamship Company, of the Dollar Lumber Company, of the Admiral Dollar Company, of the Dollar Portland Lumber Company, of the Canadian Robert Dollar Company, and director in any number of other corporations. It is said that his name stands for a thing greater than power or wealth—integrity, one of the first principles of Masonry.
