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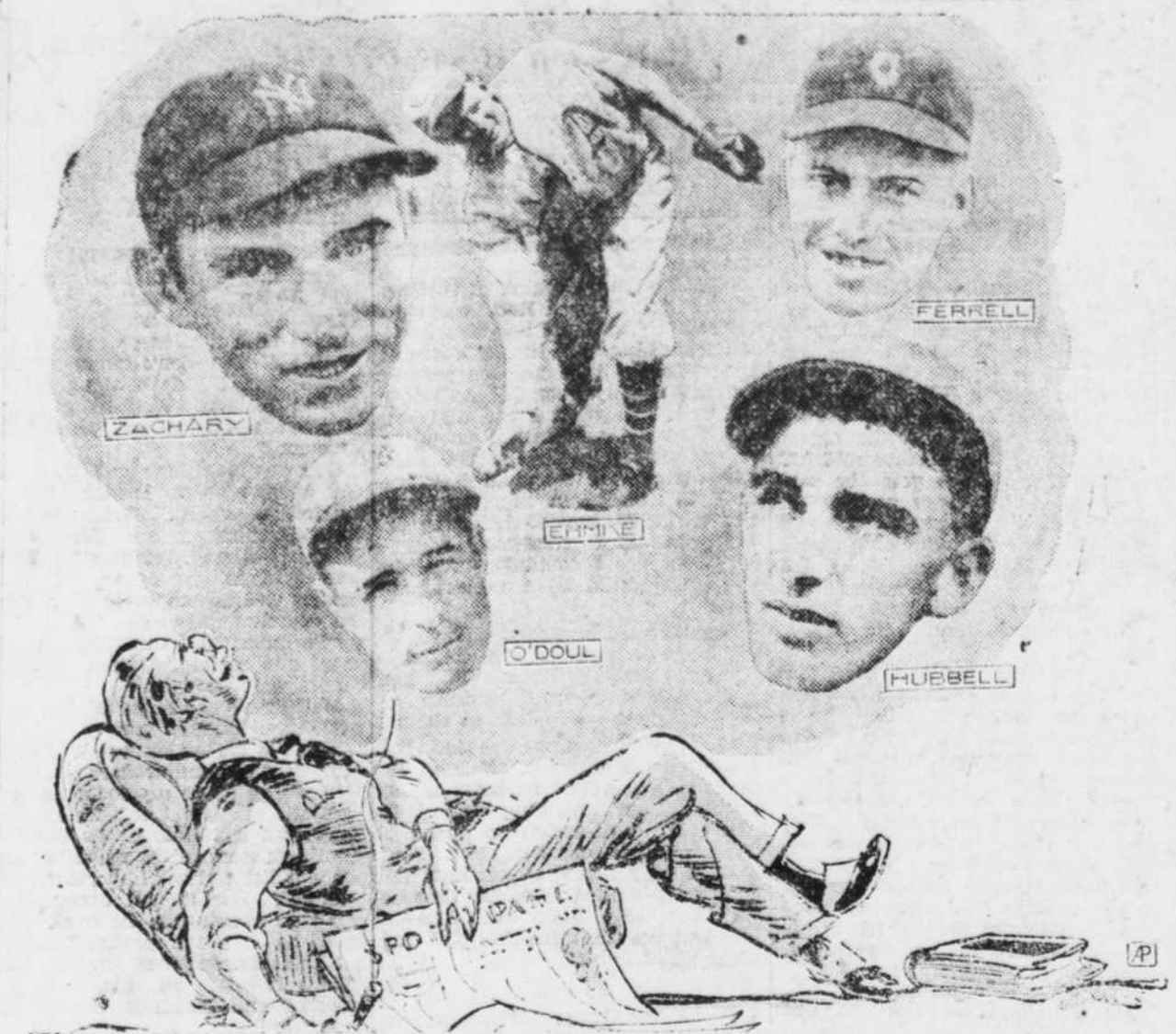
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Five Share Honors of Drab Season



The 1929 baseball program as a whole excited few persons outside of the hard-hitting statisticians. Yet it was punctuated by some brilliant individual playings.

By JAY VESSELS (Sports Editor) - Feature Service - NEW YORK, Oct. 28 (AP) - This year's edition of major league baseball was one long unexciting season but the genuine fan will tell you there were some rare occurrences worth remembering.

These were lost sight of in the excitement over the A's runaway race for world's championship honors. Now, however, memories of...

Some of the 1929 highlights are bounding back to the forefront. Ranking high among the prize individual performances is the new National league record of 254 hits established by Lefty O'Doul and the 1,000 per cent pitching by Tom Zachary who became the first major league regular to finish a season without a single defeat marring his mound work. He won 12 games and lost none.

O'Doul, like Zachary, was doing a comeback. In addition to setting a new high mark in hits, Lefty Frank batted 400 for 154 games to lead the National league slugger, and to top the American league batting champion by 31 points.

Other features of the 1929 campaign were the no-hit game pitched by Carl Hubbell, May 8, when he beat Pittsburgh, 7 to 0, and the 21 victories turned in by Wes Ferrell, who had never pitched in a major league ball game until last May.

And topping the whole show, perhaps, was that surprise world's series victory pitched by Howard Ehmke who fanned 13 Cubs for a new record.

Further establishing its claim as the "flower garden of the world" San Mateo county, lying directly south of San Francisco, has accomplished this unprecedented achievement and supplied virtually every major city in the United States with fresh cut flowers.

Transfer of the battlefield for the Professional Golfers' association championship from Santa Barbara to Los Angeles doubtless will be good news for Leo Diegel, the defending champion.

"My opinion is that the boys may as well wrap it up and let Leo have it by default," said George Von Elm, a former Los Angeles amateur star, now resident at Detroit.

"They are going to play at Hillcrest," and if there's a golf course in the country that Leo can eat alive, it's Hillcrest. Why, Leo burns it up every time he steps out on it."

Diegel, however, will have plenty of opposition. The Agua Caliente pro last year broke the long reign of Walter Hagen and the Hag will fight desperately to get back on the throne. Horton Smith, Johnny Farrell, Gene Sarazen, Bill Mehlhorn, Bobby Cruickshank, perhaps Mac Smith, and the other stars of the salaried brigade will be out there swinging.

Leo has his inspired moments when he could give a stroke or two each way to any golfer in the world and one may strike him early in December when he tries to repeat in the P. G. A. event. The fact that the championship course is especially to his liking will not hurt a bit.

Poor Charlie Root, the Cubs' losing pitcher in the first game of the World series, came in for a lot of harsh second guessing for using bad judgment in pitching to Jimmy Foxx, the Athletics' slugging first baseman, in the seventh inning when the score was nothing to nothing.

With two strikes on the Maryland marvel, Root saw his next pitch slammed over the fence in center field. The critics said that with two strikes and no balls, Root should not have given Foxx a good ball to hit. The proper pitching strategy, they argue, would have been to make an effort to get Foxx to go after a bad ball.

As a matter of fact, that is just what Root did. He pitched hard and inside and Foxx went after it. To make it worse for Root, he connected with it, had ball and all, and drove it out of the playing field. It so happens that Foxx, a powerful boy with great wrists, can make home runs from bad balls. So can Al Simmons, his hard hitting teammate. A pitcher finds himself in a difficult situation when he can not waste a ball without danger of seeing it sail out of the park.

JCS McCARTHY, manager of the Cubs, was rebuked by the grandstand managers in the first game of the series for sending in a hitless pinch hitter for Root, when the score was 1 to 0 against the Cubs. The strategy of the Cub pilot, seemed sound. Root was pitching good ball but he was a run behind in the seventh and there was no indication that the Cubs would score later if they failed in the seventh when the tying and winning runs were ready to sail home on a single.

Hartnett certainly had a better chance than Root. Bush, Root's reliever, permitted two more runs to score through no fault of his pitching. The Cubs did score one in the ninth, but they might not have counted if the inning had opened with the count 1 to 0 in favor of the A's, instead of 3 to 0.
